A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that providers and 1 operators of domiciliary homes and apartment complexes offer 2 valuable residential services for individuals with developmental 3 disabilities or mental retardation who are unable to live 4 independently and who require supervision or care. Despite 5 additional funding through the department of health, domiciliary 6 home providers and apartment complex operators experience 7 difficulty in providing much needed services to persons whose 8 care has been entrusted to the State of Hawaii. 9 One provider, the Arc in Hawaii, has had to close four 10 community-based residences on Oahu and four community-based 11 residences on Kauai. Many providers and operators have 12 expressed frustration at their inability to fully staff 13 essential positions and provide adequate resources to serve 14 persons with developmental disabilities. The legislature 15 believes that lack of funding from the State will result in more 16

closures of domiciliary homes and apartment complexes.
