A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CARE HOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 46-15.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) For the purpose of regulation under a county's life 4 safety code, building code, fire code, or any other ordinance of similar purpose, a licensed adult family boarding home or 5 6 licensed care home which provides living accommodations for: 7 (1)The operator of the home and operator's family; and 8 Up to [five] six other persons, not more than [two] (2) 9 three of whom are incapable of self-preservation 10 because of age or physical or mental limitations; 11 shall be deemed a single-family dwelling occupied by a family." 12 SECTION 2. Section 321-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 14 "(b) The director shall adopt rules regarding adult residential care homes in accordance with chapter 91 which shall 15 16 be designed to: **17** (1) Protect the health, safety, and civil rights of
- 18 persons residing in facilities regulated;

2	homes; provided that the rules shall allow group
3	living in two categories of adult residential care

17	"Handicapped person" means an individual with a
18	physical handicap as defined under section 515-2.
19	"Developmentally disabled person" means a person
20	with developmental disabilities as defined under
21	section 333F-1.

1		"Totally disabled person" means a person totally
2		disabled as defined under section 235-1;
3	(3)	Comply with applicable federal laws and regulations of
4		Title XVI of the Social Security Act, as amended; and
5	(4)	Provide penalties for the failure to comply with any
6		rule."

16	""Coi	mmunity care foster family home" or "home" means a home
17	that, for	the purposes of this part:
18	(1)	Is regulated by the department in accordance with
19		rules that are equitable in relation to rules that
20		govern expanded adult residential care homes;
21	(2)	Is issued a certificate of approval by the department
22		or its designee to provide, for a fee, twenty-four-

1	hour living accommodations, including personal care
2	and homemaker services, for not more than [two] three
3	adults at any one time, at least $[\frac{\text{one}}{\text{one}}]$ $\underline{\text{two}}$ of whom
4	shall be $[a]$ medicaid $[recipient,]$ $recipients,$ who are
5	at the nursing facility level of care, who are
6	unrelated to the foster family, and \underline{who} are receiving

17	(b) Community care foster family homes shall be required
18	to reserve at least [one bed] two beds for medicaid patients.

20	required to reserve at least one bed for medicaid patients."
