4	the State or in the service of any county shall be citizens,
5	nationals, or permanent resident aliens of the United States, or
6	eligible under federal law for unrestricted employment in the
7	United States, and [residents of] shall establish residency in
8	the State [at the time of] within thirty days after their
9	[application for] employment and as a condition of eligibility
10	for continued employment.
11	"Resident" means a person who is physically present in the
12	State at the time the person claims to have established the
13	person's domicile in the State and shows the person's intent is
14	to make Hawaii the person's [permanent] <u>primary</u> residence. [In
15	determining this intent, the following factors shall be

17	(1) Maintenance of a domicile or permanent place of
