A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DERELICT VEHICLE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 290-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§290-8 Derelict vehicle. A vehicle shall be deemed a		
4	derelict <u>vehicle</u> by the administrative head of the county agency		
5	designated to carry out section 290-1, or by the executive		
6	director or a representative of the director of the [housing and		
7	community development corporation of Hawaii public housing		
8	administration in the case of a vehicle [which] that has been		
9	abandoned on property owned, managed, or administered by the		
10	[corporation,] administration, if major parts have been removed		
11	or material damage to the vehicle has rendered the vehicle		
12	inoperable and one of the following conditions exists:		
13	(1) The vehicle is registered for the current registration		
14	period and the registered and legal owners no longer		
15	reside at the addresses on record with the county		
16	director of finance;		

1	(2)	The vehicle has been registered for the current or	
2		previous registration period and the registered and	
3		legal owners disclaim ownership;	
4	(3)	The vehicle identification number and license plates	
5		have been removed so as to nullify efforts to locate	
6		or identify the current registered and legal owners;	
7	(4)	The vehicle has not been registered for the current or	
8		previous registration periods; <u>or</u>	
9	(5)	The vehicle registration records of the county	
10		director of finance contain no record that the vehicle	
11		has ever been registered in the county[; or	
12	(6)	The vehicle is ten model years old or older].	
13	Prior to	authorizing the removal of a derelict vehicle, the	
14	administr	ative head of the county agency designated to carry out	
15	section 2	90-1 or the executive director or a representative of	
16	the director of [the housing and community development		
17	corporation of Hawaii the Hawaii public housing administration		
18	in the ca	se of vehicles [which] that have been abandoned on	
19	property owned, managed, or operated by the [corporation,]		
20	administration, shall notify the county chief of police only if		
21	the vehicle is reported stolen or otherwise needed for police		
22	investigation."
