A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE ROADS IN LIMBO PROGRAM FOR THE COUNTY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Roads in limbo are roads that neither the State
- 2 nor the county of Hawaii highways divisions maintain. They are
- 3 roads that are typically referred to as government roads and
- 4 homestead roads. They were previously roads of the Territory of
- 5 Hawaii, jurisdiction over which is at issue between the State
- 6 and the county. The matter of jurisdiction has not been
- 7 resolved, but the State and county are currently in the process
- 8 of addressing roads in limbo issues.
- 9 Residents who reside on the roads in limbo have made
- 10 frequent requests to the county of Hawaii for repairs and
- 11 maintenance of the roads. The county has responded to their
- 12 requests on a very limited basis, pursuant to the direction of
- 13 the county civil defense agency. Other than in response to an
- 14 emergency situation, the county of Hawaii does not have the
- 15 resources to properly maintain these roads in a fair and
- 16 consistent manner. In the county of Hawaii, there are an

- 1 estimated four hundred fifty-nine miles of roads that fall into
- 2 the roads in limbo category.
- 3 The county public works department has established a
- 4 protocol to develop a maintenance program, which includes the
- 5 following:
- **6** (1) Surveying each road;
- 7 (2) Physically verifying the miles of roads in limbo;
- **8** (3) Determining the condition of each road and
- 9 categorizing each road;
- 10 (4) Evaluating culverts and bridges;
- 11 (5) Prioritizing the repairs of roads by district; and
- 12 (6) Considering land acquisition and realignment of some
- roads.
- 14 At twenty-five miles per year, it would take the county an
- 15 estimated eighteen years to complete their maintenance program,
- 16 at a cost in excess of \$2,000,000 per year. The county of
- 17 Hawaii is requesting \$2,000,000 in state moneys with the
- 18 intention of using county funds to match the state appropriation
- 19 in the first year, to establish a roads in limbo program, and
- 20 work with the state department of transportation in the hope of
- 21 establishing a long-term partnership. Even if that long-term
- 22 goal fails, the \$2,000,000 appropriated this year would enable

- 1 the county to start the program and finally make a dent in what
- 2 has been, until now, an increasing problem.
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 for a
- 6 grant-in-aid to the county of Hawaii for the establishment of a
- 7 roads in limbo program to resolve issues relating to roads in
- $oldsymbol{8}$ the county of Hawaii where state and county jurisdiction are not
- 9 certain.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of
- 11 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
