A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHAPTER 291E, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: "S291E- Illegal operation of a vehicle while under court 4 5 order of revocation of privilege to operate a vehicle. (a) A 6 person commits the offense of illegal operation of a vehicle 7 while under court order of revocation of privilege to operate a 8 vehicle if the person operates or assumes actual physical 9 control of a vehicle after the person has had the person's 10 privilege to operate a vehicle revoked by a court order pursuant to this chapter, or revoked by a court order pursuant to section 11 200-81, 291-4, 291-4.4, 291-4.5, or 291-7 as those provisions 12 were in effect on December 31, 2001. 13 14 It is an affirmative defense that the person had the

- person's privilege to operate a vehicle restored by court order
- 16 prior to the date of the alleged offense.

16		(C) Permanent revocation of the person's license and
17		privilege to operate a vehicle.
18	The perio	d of revocation shall commence upon the release of the
19	person fr	om the period of imprisonment imposed pursuant to this
20	section."

SECTION 2. Section 291E-62, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending the title and subsection (a) to read as 3 follows: 4 "§291E-62 Operating a vehicle after license and privilege have been administratively suspended or revoked for operating a 5 vehicle under the influence of an intoxicant; penalties. (a) 6 No person whose license and privilege to operate a vehicle have 7 been revoked, suspended, or otherwise restricted pursuant to 8 this section or to part III [or section 291E-61 or 291E-61.5,] 9 of this chapter, or to part VII or part XIV of chapter 286 [or 10 11 section 200-81, 291-4, 291-4.4, 291-4.5, or 291-7] as those provisions were in effect on December 31, 2001, shall operate or 12 assume actual physical control of any vehicle: 13 In violation of any restrictions placed on the 14 (1)15 person's license; or While the person's license or privilege to operate a 16 (2) vehicle remains suspended or revoked." 17 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 18 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 19 20 begun, before its effective date.

SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
