A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Hawaii faces a critical lack of affordable 1 housing for its people. As property values skyrocket and the 2 3 available housing inventory continues to decline, ordinary working families are hard-pressed, and far too often unable, to 4 5 afford rapidly rising rents. 6 The purpose of this Act is to alleviate the housing squeeze 7 for Hawaii's workers by meeting up to thirty per cent of the 8 expected rental needs of the state's population that earns up to 9 eighty per cent of the median family income as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development by: 10 11 (1) Providing \$1,000,000 in low-interest construction loans administered by the counties; and 12 Funding administrative costs for the counties to 13 (2)14 facilitate the permitting process, 15 for ohana housing units for fiscal year 2006-2007. 16 Estimates suggest that:

- 8 to the counties on a first-come, first-served basis for the
- 9 purposes of this section.
