A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XII, SECTION 6, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an 2 amendment to article XII, section 6, of the Constitution of the 3 State of Hawaii to allow for the transfer of powers bestowed 4 upon and moneys owed to the office of Hawaiian affairs, as its pro rata share of public land trust revenues, to the department 5 of Hawaiian home lands if an unappealable federal court decision 6 7 determines that the existence of the office of Hawaiian affairs 8 is in violation of the United States Constitution. 9 SECTION 2. Article 12, section 6, of the Constitution of 10 the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows: 11 "Section 6. The board of trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs shall exercise power as provided by law: 12 13 manage and administer the proceeds from the sale or other 14 disposition of the lands, natural resources, minerals and income 15 derived from whatever sources for native Hawaiians and Hawaiians, including all income and proceeds from that pro rata 16

1 for native Hawaiians; to formulate policy relating to affairs of 2 native Hawaiians and Hawaiians; and to exercise control over 3 real and personal property set aside by state, federal or private sources and transferred to the board for native 4 5 Hawaiians and Hawaiians. The board shall have the power to exercise control over the Office of Hawaiian Affairs through its 6 executive officer, the administrator of the Office of Hawaiian 7 Affairs, who shall be appointed by the board [-]; provided that 8 9 if an unappealable federal court decision determines that the existence of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs is in violation of 10 the United States Constitution, then the powers established and 11 12 proceeds, income, and revenue identified under this section shall be transferred from the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to the 13 department of Hawaiian home lands as provided by law." 14 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall 15 16 be as follows: 17 "Shall the powers bestowed upon and moneys owed to the office of Hawaiian affairs as its pro rata share of public 18 19 land trust revenues, be transferred to the department of 20 Hawaiian home lands if an unappealable federal court 21 decision determines that the existence of the office of
