A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM RESEARCH AND STATISTICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 201-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:

"\$201-3 Specific research and promotional functions of the

4 department. Without prejudice to its general functions and

duties the department of business, economic development, and

6 tourism shall have specific functions in the following areas:

determine through technical and economic surveys the profit potential of new or expanded industrial undertakings; develop through research projects and other means new and improved industrial products and processes; promote studies and surveys to determine consumer preference as to design and quality and to determine the best methods of packaging, transporting, and marketing the [State's] state's industrial products; disseminate information to assist the present industries of the [State,] state, and to encourage

1		capital investment in present and new industries in
2		the [State; state; assist associations of producers
3		and distributors of industrial products to introduce
4		such products to consumers; and make such grants or
5		contracts as may be necessary or advisable to
6		accomplish the foregoing;
7	(2)	Land development. The department shall encourage the
8		most productive use of all land in the [State] state
9		in accordance with a general plan developed by the
10		department; encourage the improvement of land tenure
11		practices on leased private lands; promote an
12		informational program directed to landowners,
13		producers of agricultural and industrial commodities,
14		and the general public regarding the most efficient
15		and most productive use of the lands in the [State;]
16		state; and make such grants or contracts as may be
17		necessary or advisable to accomplish the foregoing;
18	(3)	Credit development. The department shall conduct a
19		continuing study of agricultural and industrial credit
20		needs; encourage the development of additional private
21		and public credit sources for agricultural and
22		industrial enterprises; promote an informational

1		program to acquaint financial institutions with
2		agricultural and industrial credit needs and the
3		potential for agricultural and industrial expansion,
4		and inform producers of agricultural and industrial
5		products as to the manner in which to quality for
6		loans; and make such grants or contracts as may be
7		necessary or advisable to accomplish the foregoing;
8	(4)	Promotion. The department shall disseminate
9		information developed for or by the department
10		pertaining to economic development to assist present
11		industry in the [State, state, attract new industry
12		and investments to the [State, state, and assist new
13		and emerging industry with good growth potential or
14		prospects in jobs, exports, and new products. The
15		industrial and economic promotional activities of the
16		department may include the use of literature,
17		advertising, demonstrations, displays, market testing,
18		lectures, travel, motion picture and slide films, and
19		such other promotional and publicity devices as may be
20		appropriate; and

1	(3)	Tourism research and statistics. The department shar			
2		maintain a program of research and statistics for the			
3		purpose of:			
4		(A)	Meas	uring and analyzing tourism trends;	
5		(B)	Prov	iding information and research to assist in	
6			the	development and implementation of state	
7			tour	ism policy;	
8		(C)	Enco	uraging and arranging for the conduct of	
9			tour	ism research and information development	
10			thro	ugh voluntary means or through contractual	
11			serv	ices with qualified agencies, firms, or	
12			pers	ons; and	
13		(D)	Prov	iding tourism information to policy makers,	
14			the	public, and the visitor [industry. This	
15			incl	udes: industry, including:	
16			(i)	Collecting and publishing visitor-related	
17				data including visitor arrivals, visitor	
18				characteristics and expenditures;	
19			(ii)	Collecting and publishing hotel-related	
20				statistics including the number of units	
21				available, occupancy rates, and room rates:	

1	(iii)	Collecting and publishing airline-related	
2		data including seat capacity and number of	
3		flights;	
4	(iv)	Collecting information and conducting	
5		analyses of the economic, social, and	
6		physical impacts of tourism on the [State;]	
7		state;	
8	(v)	Conducting periodic studies of the impact of	
9		ongoing marketing programs of the Hawaii	
10		tourism authority on Hawaii's tourism	
11		industry, employment in Hawaii, state taxes,	
12		and the [State's] state's lesser known and	
13		underutilized destinations; and	
14	(vi)	[Cooperate] Cooperating with the Hawaii	
15		tourism authority and [provide] providing it	
16		with the above information in a timely	
17		manner[-];	
18	provi	ded that the funding for tourism research and	
19	stati	stics shall be as provided in section 201B-	
20	<u>11(c)</u>	<u>.</u>	
21	The department	shall be the central agency to coordinate	
22	film permit activities in the State."		

1	SECT	ION 2. Section 201B-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	"(C)	Moneys in the tourism special fund shall be used by
4	the autho	rity for the purposes of this chapter; provided that:
5	(1)	Not more than five per cent of this amount shall be
6		used for administrative expenses, including \$15,000
7		for a protocol fund to be expended at the discretion
8		of the executive director; [and]
9	(2)	At least \$1,000,000 shall be made available to support
10		efforts to manage, improve, and protect Hawaii's
11		natural environment and areas frequented by
12		visitors[+]; and
13	(3)	Funds in the tourism special fund shall be transferred
14		to the department of business, economic development,
15		and tourism to fund tourism research and statistics
16		under section 201-3(5); provided that the funding
17		under this paragraph shall be in accordance with a
18		master plan and budget developed by the department of
19		business, economic development, and tourism, in
20		coordination with the authority."

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 2 provided that the amendments made to section 201B-11(c), Hawaii
- 3 Revised Statutes, shall not be repealed when section 201B-11,
- 4 Hawaii Revised Statutes, is reenacted on June 30, 2007, pursuant
- 5 to section 50 of Act 22, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005.
