A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to: |

 4 aerial common fireworks may be purchased, set off, ignited, or

- 22 for any person to set off, ignite, or discharge fireworks at any

- 2 in which the permitted activity is to occur.
- 3 (b) The fee for the permit shall not exceed \$ for
- 4 each year or fraction of a year in which the permittee plans to
- 5 conduct business or participate in a religious or ceremonial
- 6 activity and shall be payable to the county in which the
- 7 permitted activity is to occur.
- 9 under section -4 shall be issued by the council and shall be
- 10 nontransferable. The license shall specify the date of issuance
- 11 and the date of expiration, which shall be March 31 of each
- 12 year. The application shall be made on a form setting forth:
- 13 (1) The date upon which the importations are to begin;
- 14 (2) The address of the location of the importer; and
- 15 (3) The name of the proprietor or, if a partnership, the
- name of the partnership and the names of all partners
- or, if a corporation, the name of the corporation and
- the names of its officers.
- 19 (b) Each storage, wholesaling, and retailing site shall be
- 20 required to obtain a separate license. The license shall
- 21 specify the date of issuance and the date of expiration, which

shall be March 31 of each year. The application shall be made 1 2 on a form setting forth: The date upon which the storage, sale, or offers for 3 (1)4 sale are to begin; The address of the location of the licensee; and 5 (2) The names of the person using the fireworks for (3) religious or ceremonial purposes; the proprietor, the 7 partnership, including the name of the partnership and 8 9 the names of all partners; or the corporation, including the name of the corporation and the name of 10 all its officers. 11 Any license issued pursuant to this chapter may be 12 revoked by the council if the licensee violates any provision of 13 this chapter or if the licensee stores or handles the fireworks 14 in such a manner as to present an unreasonable safety hazard. 15 It shall be unlawful for any person, other than a 16 wholesaler who is selling or transferring fireworks to a 17 licensed retailer, to sell or offer to sell any fireworks to any 18 person who does not present a permit duly issued as required by 19 -5. The permit shall be signed by the seller or 20 transferor at the time of sale or transfer of the fireworks, and 21

the seller or transferor shall indicate on the permit the amount

- 2 or deliver fireworks to any permittee in any amount in excess of
- 3 the amount specified in the permit, less the amount shown on the
- 4 permit previously to have been purchased.
- 5 (e) Any license issued pursuant to this chapter shall be
- 6 prominently displayed in public view at each licensed location.
- 7 § -7 Application for permit. (a) Any permit required
- 8 under section -5 shall be issued by the county and be
- 9 nontransferable. The county shall issue permits for which
- 10 complete applications have been submitted and that contain only
- 11 correct information. The permit shall specify the date of
- 12 issuance and the date of expiration but in no case for a period
- 13 to exceed one year. The application shall be made on a form
- 14 setting forth:
- 15 (1) The dates for which the permit shall be valid;
- 16 (2) The location where the permitted activity is to occur;

| 7 | (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to offer for sale, |
| 8 | sell, or give any fireworks to minors. It shall be unlawful for |
| 9 | any minor to possess, purchase, or set off, ignite, or otherwise |
| 10 | cause to explode any fireworks. |
| 11 | (b) The parents, guardian, and other persons having the |
| 12 | custody or control of any minor, who knowingly permit the minor |
| 13 | to possess, purchase, set off, ignite, or otherwise cause to |
| 14 | explode any fireworks, shall be deemed to be in violation of |
| 15 | this chapter and shall be subject to the penalties under section |
| 16 | -9; provided that: |
| 17 | (1) The parents or guardian may allow the minor to use |
| 18 | fireworks while under the immediate supervision and |

control of the parent or guardian or under the

supervision and control of another adult; and
