A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Findings and purpose. The legislature finds
2	that with in-migration and the graying of our population, among
3	other things, the demographics of the state are evolving. Over
4	the past twenty-five years, the statewide population has
5	increasingly shifted from the urban core to the suburbs,
6	especially on Oahu, where the population center has steadily
7	moved to the western side of the island. Meanwhile, some of the
8	areas in the state with the fastest growing populations are
9	Kihei, Maui, and west Hawaii. These shifts in demographics have
10	overburdened public school facilities in growing areas and left
11	some public school facilities in other areas underutilized.
12	Thus, the legislature believes there is a need to revitalize
13	school facilities statewide, including building or expanding
14	schools in certain areas, and consolidating or closing schools
15	in other areas.
16	However, the legislature finds that despite broad-based
17	public recognition of Hawaii's changing demographics, there is
18	often little public support for changes that affect specific

1	constituencies. In particular, this is true of proposals to
2	close or consolidate public schools to maximize resources.
3	The legislature recognizes the difficulties, political and
4	otherwise, inherent in these decisions. But in the face of
5	increasing educational priorities, the legislature believes that
6	just as the construction or expansion of some schools is
7	important, the consolidation or closure of other schools is also
8	necessary. It is important that any actions to do so, be taken
9	through a very objective and transparent process that benefits
10	the most public school students and their families.
11	The purpose of this Act is to revitalize school facilities
12	statewide and to more effectively and efficiently use our
13	taxpayers' investment in public education. Specifically, this
14	Act provides for the timely construction, expansion,
15	consolidation, or closure of public schools in Hawaii through ar
16	objective and transparent process that:
17	(1) Includes the establishment of a facilities alignment
18	commission that shall:
19	(A) Establish criteria for the selection of public
20	schools to be constructed, expanded,
21	consolidated, or closed; and

1		(B) Recommend, based upon these criteria, a list of
2		areas for new school construction, and of schools
3		for expansion, consolidation, or closure, that is
4		subject to the review of the legislature;
5		and
6	(2)	Directs the board of education to proceed with the
7		process of constructing, expanding, consolidating, or
8		closing schools according to the recommendations of
9		the facilities alignment commission.
10	SECT	ION 2. Facilities alignment commission. (a) There is
11	establish	ed the facilities alignment commission, to be attached
12	to the de	partment of education for administrative purposes.
13	The	commission shall be composed of nine members appointed
14	by the go	vernor as follows:
15	(1)	Three members shall be appointed from a list of
16		nominees submitted by the president of the senate; and
17	(2)	Three members shall be appointed from a list of
18		nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of
19		representatives.
20	(b)	The chairperson of the commission shall be selected by
21	the membe	rs of the commission.

- (c) Members of the commission shall not be employees of
 the State.
- 3 (d) Any substantive action taken by the commission
- 4 pursuant to sections 4 through 6 of this Act shall be approved
- 5 by a two-thirds vote of its members. For all other actions of
- 6 the commission, five members shall constitute a quorum to do
- 7 business, of which a majority vote shall suffice.
- 8 (e) The commission shall be exempt from chapter 91, Hawaii
- 9 Revised Statutes, but shall be subject to chapters 92 and 92F,
- 10 Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 11 (f) The members of the commission shall serve without
- 12 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses necessary for
- 13 the performance of their duties, including travel expenses.
- 14 (g) The department of education shall provide
- 15 administrative support to the commission. The commission shall
- 16 have access to all records in the department of education and
- 17 department of accounting and general services pertinent to its
- 18 duties and may request research and analysis assistance from the
- 19 department of education. Pursuant to chapter 92F, the
- 20 commission shall maintain the confidentiality of all
- 21 confidential information.

1	(n)	The commission shall terminate upon adjournment of the	
2	regular l	egislative session of 2008, sine die.	
3	SECT	ION 3. Procedures for making recommendations for	
4	school al	ignment; school facilities plan. (a) The department	
5	of education shall submit to the commission by August 31, 2006,		
6	a thirty-year school facilities plan for the department of		
7	education. The school facilities plan shall be based on the		
8	department's assessment of the projected student enrollment for		
9	every pub	lic school in the state, except for charter schools.	
10	In conduc	ting the assessment, the department shall:	
11	(1)	Consider the six-year program and financial plan	
12		prepared pursuant to section 37-69, Hawaii Revised	
13		Statutes, to the extent it is applicable;	
14	(2)	Develop and consider a thirty-year projection of the	
15		enrollment at each school across the State and the	
16		resulting need for facilities; and	
17	(3)	Consider other reliable data relative to population	
18		growth and trends, and anticipated levels of funding	
19		necessary for every school.	
20	(b)	The school facilities plan shall include:	
21	(1)	A description of the assessment of projected student	
22		enrollment pursuant to subsection (a);

1	(2)	A comprehensive inventory of all department of
2		education facilities;
3	(3)	For each school district, thirty-year projections for
4		the numbers and locations of schools required annually
5		to accommodate the numbers and types of students in
6		the projected enrollment; and
7	(4)	Recommendations for the construction, expansion,
8		consolidation, or closure of schools based on the
9		projections and assessment made pursuant to this
10		section.
11	SECT	ION 4. School alignment selection criteria. (a) By
12	December :	31, 2006, the commission shall establish the criteria
13	that will	be used by the commission to select:
14	(1)	Areas for new school construction;
15	(2)	Schools for expansion, except charter schools; and
16	(3)	Schools to be consolidated or closed, except charter
17		schools.
18	The	criteria shall require the consideration of:
19	(1)	The overutilization or underutilization of school
20		facilities;
21	(2)	The impact of the consolidation or closure of a school
22		on the community in which it is located; and

1	(3)	The costs or savings resulting from the continued
2		operation, consolidation, or closure of a school,
3		including the costs of deferred and future repair and
4		maintenance.
5	(b)	Before finalizing the school alignment selection
6	criteria,	the commission shall hold public hearings to obtain
7	public re	sponse to the commission's proposed criteria. For each
8	public he	aring, the commission shall provide appropriate notice,
9	as define	d in section 1-28.5, both statewide and county-wide in
10	each coun	ty of the state. The commission shall make available
11	to the pu	blic draft copies of its proposed criteria not less
12	than two	weeks prior to the start of the public hearings.
13	SECT	ION 5. Preliminary recommendations. (a) By February
14	28, 2007,	based on the school facilities plan developed pursuant
15	to sectio	n 3 and the final school alignment selection criteria
16	adopted p	ursuant to section 4, the commission shall compile a
17	prelimina	ry list of recommended:
18	(1)	Areas for new school construction;
19	(2)	Schools for expansion, except charter schools;
20	(3)	Schools to be consolidated, except charter schools;
21		and
22	(4)	Schools to be closed, except charter schools.

- 1 (b) The list of recommendations shall include a summary of
- 2 the selection process that resulted in the recommendation of
- 3 each area or school on the list, including a justification for
- 4 each recommendation.
- 5 (c) In selecting areas and schools for the list, the
- 6 commission shall consider equally all schools within the state,
- 7 without regard to whether the board of education had previously
- 8 considered the school for consolidation or closure.
- 9 SECTION 6. Public hearings and final recommendations by
- 10 the commission. (a) By August 31, 2007, the commission shall
- 11 hold public hearings to obtain public response to the
- 12 commission's preliminary recommendations. For each public
- 13 hearing, the commission shall provide appropriate notice as
- 14 defined in section 1-28.5, both statewide and county-wide in
- 15 each county of the state. The commission shall make available
- 16 to the public draft copies of the preliminary recommendations
- 17 not less than two weeks prior to the start of the public
- 18 hearings.
- 19 (b) Not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 20 the regular session of 2008, the commission shall submit to the
- 21 legislature a report of its findings and conclusions, including
- 22 a final list of recommendations for:

Areas for new school construction; 1 (1)Schools for expansion, except charter schools; 2 (2) Schools to be consolidated, except charter schools; 3 (3) 4 and Schools to be closed, except charter schools. 5 (4)The final list of recommendations shall be subject to 6 legislative disapproval only in their entirety, by concurrent 7 resolution. 8 If the legislature does not disapprove the 9 recommendations pursuant to subsection (c), then after the 10 adjournment of the regular legislative session of 2008, sine 11 die, the board of education shall begin compliance with the 12 recommendations of the commission for the 2009-2010 school year 13 14 to: Construct new schools; 15 (1) (2) Expand schools; and 16 (3) Consolidate or close schools. 17 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 18 or so much revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 for 20 expenses incurred by the facilities alignment commission in 21

carrying out its duties.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.

Report Title:

School Facilities; Facilities Alignment Commission

Description:

Creates the Facilities Alignment Commission to revitalize school facilities, including establishing criteria for the selection and recommendation of areas for new schools, schools for expansion, and schools for consolidation or closure. Allows the Legislature to disapprove these recommendations only in its entirety, and requires the Board of Education to proceed with these recommendations. (HB2743 HD1)
