BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	"§286- Revocation of driver's license for drug							
5	offense. (a) If any person is found by a court of competent							
6	jurisdiction to have committed an act that would constitute an							
7	offense under part IV of chapter 712, the court shall revoke the							
8	person's driver's license for a period of six months, or, if the							
9	person is under the age of eighteen years, until that person is							
10	eighteen years of age, whichever is longer. The court shall							
11	impose this penalty in addition to any other penalties							
12	authorized by law and regardless of whether the person was							
13	operating a motor vehicle at the time of the offense.							
14	(b) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,							
15	whenever a court revokes a person's driver's license pursuant to							
16	this section, the examiner of drivers shall not grant to the							
17	person a new driver's license until expiration of the period of
