A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSUMER ADVOCATE FOR APPROPRIATE HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that patients do not
- 2 always receive health care that is appropriate for their
- $oldsymbol{3}$ individual situations and, at times, appropriate health care is
- 4 denied to a patient based upon an opinion or evaluation by a
- 5 source other than the treating physician. Although it is
- 6 undeniable that health care costs are high and ever-increasing
- 7 and that the cost of health care needs to be contained,
- 8 appropriate health care must not be denied based upon a desire
- 9 to contain costs.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to empower the consumer advocate
- 11 to advocate for the provision of appropriate health care to each
- 12 health care consumer based upon the evaluation of every medical
- 13 opinion received, regardless of source, while according priority
- 14 to the medical opinion of the patient's treating physician.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:

1	"§269- Evaluation of medical opinions; treating source
2	physician; advocacy. The consumer advocate shall advocate for
3	and take any necessary action on behalf of health care consumers
4	to receive appropriate health care based upon the evaluation of
5	all medical opinions received, regardless of source, while
6	according priority to the medical opinion of the health care
7	consumer's treating physician, under any:
8	(1) Employer group health policy, contract, plan, or
9	agreement under article 10A of chapter 431;
10	(2) Individual and group hospital or medical service plan,
11	policy, contract, or agreement under chapter 432; or
12	(3) Policy, plan, contract, or agreement under chapter
13	432D;
14	issued or renewed in this State after December 31, 2006."
15	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
