A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TION 1. Act 85, Session Laws of Hawaii 2003, section 3		
2	is amende	ed by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
3	"(a)	There is established a temporary invasive species		
4	council f	or the special purpose of providing policy level		
5	direction	, coordination, and planning among state departments,		
6	federal a	gencies, and international and local initiatives for		
7	the control and eradication of harmful invasive species			
8	infestations throughout the State and for preventing the			
9	introduction of other invasive species that may be potentially			
10	harmful.	The council shall:		
11	(1)	Maintain a broad overview of the invasive species		
12		problem in the State;		
13	(2)	Advise, consult, and coordinate invasive species-		
14		related efforts with and between the departments of		
15		agriculture, land and natural resources, health, and		
16		transportation, as well as state, federal,		
17		international, and privately organized programs and		
18		policies;

1	(3)	Identify and prioritize each lead agency's
2		organizational and resource shortfalls with respect to
3		invasive species;
4	(4)	After consulting with appropriate state agencies,
5		create and implement a plan that includes the
6		prevention, early detection, rapid response, control,
7		enforcement, and education of the public with respect
8		to invasive species, as well as fashion a mission
9		statement articulating the State's position against
10		invasive species; provided that the plan shall give
11		priority to eradicating coqui frogs that are on lands
12		owned by the State or any county and within one mile
13		of residential areas;
14	(5)	Coordinate and promote the State's position with
15		respect to federal issues, including:
16		(A) Quarantine preemption;
17		(B) International trade agreements that ignore the
18		problem of invasive species in Hawaii;
19		(C) First class mail inspection prohibition;
20		(D) Whether quarantine of domestic pests arriving
21		from the mainland should be provided by the
22		federal government;

2			maximize resources and reduce or eliminate system
3			gaps and leaks, including deputizing the United
4			States Department of Agriculture's plant
5			protection and quarantine inspectors to enforce
6			Hawaii's laws;
7		(F)	Promoting the amendment of federal laws as
8			necessary, including the Lacey Act Amendments of
9			1981, Title 16 United States Code sections 3371-
10			3378; Public Law 97-79, and laws related to
11			inspection of domestic airline passengers,
12			baggage, and cargo; and
13		(G)	Coordinating efforts and issues with the federal
14			Invasive Species Council and its National
15			Invasive Species Management Plan;
16	(6)	Iden	tify and record all invasive species present in
17		the	State;
18	(7)	Desi	gnate the department of agriculture, health, or
19		land	and natural resources as the lead agency for each
20		func	tion of invasive species control, including
21		prev	ention, rapid response, eradication, enforcement,

(8)	Identity all state, rederal, and other moneys expended
	for the purposes of the invasive species problem in
	the State;
(9)	Identify all federal and private funds available to
	the State to fight invasive species and advise and
	assist state departments to acquire these funds;
(10)	Advise the governor and legislature on budgetary and
	other issues regarding invasive species;
(11)	Provide annual reports on budgetary and other related
	issues to the legislature twenty days prior to each
	regular session;
(12)	Include and coordinate with the counties in the fight
	against invasive species to increase resources and
	funding and to address county-sponsored activities
	that involve invasive species;
(13)	Review state agency mandates and commercial interests
	that sometimes call for the maintenance of potentially
	destructive alien species as resources for sport
	hunting, aesthetic resources, or other values;
(14)	Review the structure of fines and penalties to ensure
	maximum deterrence for invasive species-related
	crimes;

1	(15)	Suggest appropriate legislation to improve the State's
2		administration of invasive species programs and
3		policies;
4	(16)	Incorporate and expand upon the department of
5		agriculture's weed risk assessment protocol to the
6		extent appropriate for the council's invasive species
7		control and eradication efforts; and
8	(17)	Perform any other function necessary to effectuate the
9		purposes of this Act."
