A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Access to information and information
2	technology is critical, particularly for school children who
3	must be technologically literate when they leave school in order
4	to successfully compete within a skilled workforce. Students
5	who have acquired the tools and training necessary to use
6	information technology will undoubtedly have an edge over their
7	counterparts who are not technologically savvy. For an island
8	state like Hawaii, information technology can also help students
9	overcome the barriers of geography and limited resources.
10	Education systems in many states have taken measures to
11	provide students with tools such as laptop computers that can
12	significantly improve the learning environment. For instance,
13	the Maine Learning Technology Initiative provides a laptop
14	computer to every seventh- and eighth-grade student and teacher
15	in the State. Henrico County in Virginia has provided twenty-
16	seven thousand laptop computers to its high school teachers and
17	students, middle school teachers and students, and elementary
18	school teachers.

1	In 2002, the state of Michigan used state and federal funds
2	to provide laptops for eight thousand six-graders in six school
3	districts, with the intention of going statewide. In January
4	2004, the state of New Hampshire began a four-year pilot program
5	by giving laptops, wireless connectivity, and training to all
6	seventh-graders and their teachers in six schools.
7	The purpose of this Act is to provide students with
8	continual access to information and information technology by
9	providing a laptop computer to every middle and high school
10	student attending a public school within the department of
11	education.
12	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000,000, or so
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, to
15	provide a laptop computer for every middle and high school
16	student attending a public school within the department of
17	education.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
