A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRISONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that offenders who
2	receive program and employment opportunities in prison prior to
3	being released back into the community have much greater chances
4	of not returning to prison. Inmates who receive these
5	opportunities while they are classified at the minimum or
6	community custody level are more likely to successfully return
7	to society and participate as productive, law-abiding citizens.
8	Minimum custody inmates have demonstrated they can function
9	with minimal supervision in a correctional setting or in the
10	community under direct supervision. Community custody inmates
11	are eligible to participate in community release programs such
12	as work furlough, extended furlough, or residential transitional
13	living centers.
14	However, due to budget constraints, Hawaii has only two
15	minimum security prisons, Waiawa correctional facility on Oahu
16	and Kulani correctional facility on the island of Hawaii.
17	Waiawa was designed for two hundred ninety-four inmates and

Kulani often exceeds its operational capacity of one hundred

- 1 sixty beds. The legislature finds that a total of five hundred
- 2 fifty-four beds for inmates who are ready to be reintegrated
- 3 into the community is woefully lacking.
- 4 According to the department of public safety's 2004 annual
- 5 report, thirty-nine per cent of male inmates and forty-seven per
- 6 cent of female inmates are classified as minimum or community
- 7 custody. Based on the department's January 16, 2006, population
- 8 figures, this means that there are currently two thousand four
- 9 hundred fifty-nine inmates who qualify for reintegration
- 10 programs through educational opportunities, substance abuse
- 11 treatment, vocational training, employment opportunities, and
- workline projects in the community.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to increase the number of
- 14 minimum custody housing for inmates, encourage a programs
- 15 approach to inmate case management, and develop more work
- 16 opportunities for inmates to benefit the community.
- 17 SECTION 2. The department of public safety is authorized
- 18 to plan to build minimum security housing of the type that can
- 19 be erected in a fairly short amount of time, such as housing
- 20 structures used by the military, on a portion of the Kalaeloa
- 21 parcel under the jurisdiction of the Hawaii community
- 22 development authority. The department of public safety and the

- 1 Hawaii community development authority shall explore the
- 2 feasibility of planning, designing, and constructing a suitable
- 3 minimum security facility at the Kalaeloa site using pre-
- 4 fabricated and quick-build design housing programs.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 for
- 8 planning of minimum security housing for inmates.
- 9 SECTION 4. The department of public safety shall adopt a
- 10 policy that mandates all inmates to participate in-facility
- 11 programs; provided that medical and mental health concerns are
- 12 considered when waiving an inmate's participation. This
- 13 programs approach to case management will better prepare all
- 14 inmates for educational and employment opportunities when they
- 15 are released back into our neighborhoods and communities.
- 16 SECTION 5. In-facility workline programs and in-community
- 17 workline programs provide productive, mutually beneficial
- 18 results for the inmate, the facility, and the community. The
- 19 department of public safety is directed to increase the scope
- 20 and number of workline programs it currently operates at its
- 21 prison and jail facilities.

SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 1 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 2 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 for 3 developing and operating in-facility workline programs at each 4 correctional facility and in-community workline projects 5 throughout the state. 6 The sums appropriated in sections 3 and 6 shall be expended 7 by the department of public safety for the purposes of this Act. 8 SECTION 7. The department of public safety shall submit a 9 report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 10 start of the regular session of the 2007 legislature on the 11 status of this Act, including cost implications, statutory 12 impediments, and proposals for new legislation, if needed. 13 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020. 14
