# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY INNOVATION CORPORATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish, under
2	section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
3	amended, a not-for-profit natural energy laboratory of Hawaii
4	authority innovation corporation that is attached to the natural
5	energy laboratory of Hawaii authority.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 227D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
8	to read as follows:
9	"PART . NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY
10	INNOVATION CORPORATION
11	§227D-A Establishment of the natural energy laboratory of
12	Hawaii authority innovation corporation; purpose. (a) There is
13	established, as a body corporate, the natural energy laboratory
14	of Hawaii authority innovation corporation. For the purposes of
15	this part, "corporation" means the natural energy laboratory of
16	Hawaii authority innovation corporation. The corporation shall
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- 1 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. 2 corporation shall be attached to the natural energy laboratory 3 of Hawaii authority for administrative purposes.
- The purpose of the corporation shall include, but not 5 be limited to, facilitation of the growth and prosperity of the 6 State's economy by providing resources for alternative energy 7 research and development. The corporation's duties shall
- 8 include, but not be limited to:
- 9 Managing the assets and resources of the corporation, (1)10 including its land, facilities, and other resources;
- Planning, creating, and implementing any programs and 11 (2) 12 projects of the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii 13 authority that shall be assigned to the corporation, 14 including federally and state funded programs and 15 projects and programs funded by other nonprofit and 16 for-profit organizations;
- 17 Identifying and obtaining funding and other resources (3) 18 in support of the purposes of the corporation from 19 agencies and organizations not able to provide 20 resources directly to the natural energy laboratory of 21 Hawaii authority;

1	(4)	Assisting the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii
2		authority in the promotion and marketing of Hawaii as
3		a location for research and commercial natural energy
4		activity; and
5	(5)	Assisting the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii
6		authority in any other strategic or operational manner
7		that supports the State's energy-based economic
8		development activities.
9	(c)	The corporation shall implement this purpose by:
10	(1)	Furnishing the means, methods, and agencies by which
11		management, programming, training, investigation,
12		research, and analysis may be conducted;
13	(2)	Other means to make the benefits of programming,
14		training, investigation, research, and analysis
15		available to the public; and
16	(3)	Any and all other acts reasonably designed to promote
17		the foregoing purposes in the interest of promoting
18		the general welfare of the people of the State.
19	The o	corporation shall have the sole right to provide the
20	foregoing	services and support to the natural energy laboratory
21	of Hawaii	authority, and the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii
22	authority	shall use the corporation to provide these services

- 1 and support in every case except when the natural energy
- 2 laboratory of Hawaii authority determines that the corporation
- 3 may not or cannot legally or operationally provide these
- 4 services and support.
- 5 §227D-B Board of directors; composition. (a) The affairs
- 6 of the corporation shall be under the general management and
- 7 control of a board of directors consisting of nine members.
- 8 Four members of the board of directors of the natural energy
- 9 laboratory of Hawaii authority shall be ex officio, voting
- 10 members of the corporation's board, selected by the natural
- 11 energy laboratory of Hawaii authority's board of directors for
- 12 terms to be determined by the natural energy laboratory of
- 13 Hawaii authority's board of directors. The chief executive
- 14 officer of the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority
- 15 shall serve as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the
- 16 corporation's board. The remaining four members shall be
- 17 appointed by the governor from lists of nominees provided by the
- 18 president of the senate and the speaker of the house of
- 19 representatives. The governor shall appoint two persons from
- 20 the list submitted by the president of the senate and two
- 21 persons from the list submitted by the speaker of the house of
- 22 representatives. The lists of nominees provided by the

- 1 president of the senate and the speaker of the house of
- 2 representatives shall consist of members of the general public
- 3 who were selected on the basis of their knowledge, interest, and
- 4 proven expertise in, but not limited to, one or more of the
- 5 following fields: finance, commerce and trade, corporate
- 6 management, marketing, economics, engineering, energy
- 7 management, real estate development, property management,
- 8 aquaculture, ocean science, life science, and other natural
- 9 energy fields. All the members appointed from the general
- 10 public shall serve for a term of four years, except that half of
- 11 those initially appointed from the public may have reduced terms
- 12 so as to provide, as nearly as can be, for the expiration of an
- 13 equal number of terms at intervals of one year, with each term
- 14 commencing on July 1 and expiring on June 30.
- (b) All members of the corporation's board shall serve
- 16 without pay, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for
- 17 necessary expenses, including travel expenses, while attending
- 18 meetings and while in the discharge of duties and
- 19 responsibilities.
- 20 (c) The members of the corporation's board shall elect the
- 21 chairperson of the board.

1	§ <b>227</b> 1	<b>D-C Powers of the corporation.</b> The corporation, under
2	the direct	tion of its board of directors, shall have the
3	following	general powers and duties:
4	(1)	To promote the use of alternative energy and natural
5		resource sites for the purposes provided by law;
6	(2)	To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing the
7		conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers
8		and performance of duties granted to or imposed upon
9		it by law;
10	(3)	To acquire, own, lease, rent, hold, maintain and
11		improve, use, and operate any property, including
12		real, personal, mixed, tangible, or intangible
13		property, in accordance with the conditions under
14		which the property was received;
15	(4)	To enter into and perform contracts, leases,
16		cooperative agreements, or other transactions with the
17		natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority or any
18		other agency or political subdivision of the State,
19		any private person, firm, partnership, association,
20		company, or corporation, as it may be necessary in the
21		conduct of its business and on terms as it may deem
22		appropriate; provided that:

1	(A)	The corporation shall not obligate any funds of
2		the State except funds that have been
3		appropriated to it by the legislature or
4		transferred or contracted to it by the natural
5		energy laboratory of Hawaii authority or other
6		agency or department of state government; and
7	(B)	Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), the corporation
8		may enter into and perform contracts, leases,
9		cooperative agreements, or other transactions
10		with any agency or instrumentality of the United
11		States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory,
12		or a possession, or with any political
13		subdivision thereof, whenever the donating or
14		granting agency or instrumentality determines
15		that the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii
16		authority or any other agency of the State cannot
17		as effectively and efficiently accomplish the
18		purposes for which the contracts, leases,
19		cooperative agreements, or other transactions are
20		being entered into; provided that the corporation
21		shall not obligate any funds of the State except

1		lunds that have been appropriated or transferred
2		or contracted to it;
3	(5)	To receive from private sources only, gifts, grants,
4		devises, bequests, or otherwise of any property,
5		including real, personal, mixed, intangible, or
6		tangible property, held absolutely or in trust, the
7		principal or income from which may be used and
8		disposed of, in accordance with the conditions under
9		which the property was received; provided that no gift
10		to the corporation shall be accepted unless approved
11		or confirmed by its board of directors; and
12	(6)	The corporation may receive gifts, grants, or awards
13		from any agency or instrumentality of the United
14		States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a
15		possession, or from any political subdivision thereof,
16		whenever the donating or granting agency or
17		instrumentality determines that the natural energy
18		laboratory of Hawaii authority or any other agency of
19		the State cannot as effectively and efficiently

accomplish the purposes for which the gifts, grants,

or awards are being made; provided that no gift to the

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1		corporation shall be accepted unless approved or
2		confirmed by its board of directors;
3	(7)	To have a corporate seal and alter the same at its
4		pleasure;
5	(8)	To sue and be sued in its own name;
6	(9)	To serve as trustee or beneficiary under terms of any
7		gift, indenture, or will;
8	(10)	To apply for, take out, receive by purchase or gift,
9		hold, administer, and dispose of copyrights, patent
10		rights, licenses, assignments of inventions,
11		discoveries, processes, and other property, rights, or
12		interests therein, and the income thereof, absolutely
13		or subject to conditions or trusts as may be attached
14		thereto or be imposed thereon, and to obligate itself
15		to perform and execute any and all conditions or
16		trusts;
17	(11)	To conduct programs, projects, research, studies,
18		experiments, investigations, and tests in all fields
19		of knowledge; to promote and develop the scientific
20		and commercial value of inventions, discoveries, and
21		processes; and to make, publish, and distribute the
22		results thereof;

1	(12)	To coordinate and correlate activities and projects of
2		the corporation with the work of state agencies for
3		the purpose of relating research work to the economic
4	,	development of the State whenever practical or
5		desirable;
6	(13)	To stimulate and promote commercial, energy,
7		aquaculture, and research projects and activities;
8	(14)	To establish and maintain, or to assist in
9		establishing and maintaining, staff positions for the
10		purpose of aiding in energy-based economic development
11		and to enter into agreements or contracts with other
12		corporations, organizations, institutions, or persons
13		for this purpose and to pay the necessary and
14		appropriate expenses therefor;
15	(15)	To prepare, print, or publish any manuscript, research
16		article, report, study, discussion, reference,
17		collection, or any pictorial or schematic
18		representation or group or collection thereof, whether
19		the same belongs to or is the work of any state agency
20		or its employees, or the corporation or its employees
21		or a contractor of the natural energy laboratory of
22		Hawaii authority. The printing or publication may be

1		accomplished through whatever person, company, or
2		agency is deemed most appropriate by the corporation's
3		board of directors; and
4	(16)	To do any or all other acts reasonably necessary to
5		carry out the objectives and purposes of the natural
6		energy laboratory of Hawaii authority.
7	§227	D-D Corporation; exempted from certain state laws. In
8	order to	carry out the purposes and objectives of this part, the
9	corporati	on shall be granted flexibility in hiring its personnel
10	and in ha	ndling and disbursing moneys by being exempt from the
11	following	state laws:
12	(1)	Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund
13		reimbursements to the state general fund;
14	(2)	Chapter 40, related to public audit and accounting;
15	(3)	Chapter 76, relating to civil service;
16	(4)	Section 78-1, relating to public employment; and
17	(5)	Chapter 103D, relating to public procurement.
18	§ <b>22</b> 7	D-E Officers and employees of the corporation. The
19	chief exe	cutive officer of the natural energy laboratory of
20	Hawaii au	thority shall be the president of the corporation. The
21	corporati	on's president, with the agreement of the corporation's
22	board of	directors, may also appoint other officers and

- 1 employees as may be necessary in administering the affairs of
- 2 the corporation. The corporation's president, with the
- 3 agreement of the corporation's board of directors, shall set the
- 4 employees' duties, responsibilities, salaries, holidays,
- 5 vacation, leave, hours of work, and working conditions and may
- 6 grant other benefits it deems necessary. Employees of the
- 7 corporation shall not be entitled to any benefits conferred
- 8 under chapter 76, 78, 88, or 89 or any public employee
- 9 collective bargaining agreement, executive order, executive
- 10 directive, or rule.
- 11 §227D-F Annual report. The corporation shall submit an
- 12 annual report, not later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 13 of each regular session, to the governor, president of the
- 14 senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives. The
- 15 report shall include, but not be limited to, the corporation's
- 16 audited financial statement, total amount of payroll and other
- 17 disbursements made, and progress and accomplishments made during
- 18 the year.
- 19 §227D-G Dissolution. If the corporation is dissolved, all
- 20 of its property, including real, personal, and mixed property,
- 21 wheresoever situated, shall vest immediately and absolutely in
- 22 the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority and none of

- 1 its property shall inure to the benefit of any officer,
- 2 director, or member of the corporation.
- 3 §227D-H Meetings of the board. The meetings of the
- 4 corporation's board shall be open to the public as provided in
- 5 section 92-3, except that when it is necessary for the board to
- 6 receive information that:
- 7 (1) Is proprietary to a particular enterprise seeking
- 8 entry into or use of one of the corporation's
- 9 facilities; and
- 10 (2) Might be harmful to the business interest of the
- 11 enterprise if disclosed,
- 12 the board may enter into an executive meeting that is closed to
- 13 the public; provided that the executive meeting shall be limited
- 14 to discussion or consideration of trade secrets or confidential
- 15 or proprietary commercial or financial information to the extent
- 16 that the trade secrets or information fall within the exception
- 17 to public disclosure under section 92F-13.
- 18 §227D-I Confidentiality of information. Any government
- 19 record made or received by any member or employee of the
- 20 corporation shall be subject to segregation and kept
- 21 confidential to the extent permitted under chapter 92F; provided
- 22 that the information:

1	(1) Consists of business trade secrets; or
2	(2) Consists of confidential or proprietary commercial or
3	financial information regarding the operation of any
4	business.
5	§227D-J Patents, copyrights, and other rights. Any
6	patents, copyrights, inventions, discoveries, or other rights
7	arising from corporation activities shall belong to the
8	corporation and be subject to policies or rules as the
9	corporation's board of directors may adopt pursuant to chapter
10	91.
11	§227D-K Contracts with state agencies. Any contract
12	between the corporation and any agency, office, department, or
13	other administrative subdivision of the executive branch of the
14	State shall include the following:
15	(1) The contract's termination date;
16	(2) The contract's intent and purpose;
17	(3) A statement establishing the full permissible extent
18	of the contract's applicability; and
19	(4) A description of the circumstances under which the
20	contract may be amended or extended."
21	SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
22	2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute

- 1 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 2 the new sections in this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
