A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRICAL LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 448E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"§44	8E-5 Minimum requirements. [An applicant] All new
4	applicant	${f s}$ shall possess the following minimum qualifications:
5	(1)	Journey worker electrician. Every applicant to be
6		eligible for the journey worker electrician
7		examination shall be at least eighteen years of age.
8		shall provide satisfactory evidence of having
9		successfully completed an accredited academic or
10		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
11		electrical theory and the requirements of the National
12		Electric Code, and shall provide satisfactory evidence
13		of experience in residential or commercial wiring of
14		at least five years full-time or its equivalent, but
15		not less than 10,000 hours of experience in the trade
16		under the supervision of a journey worker or
17		supervising electrician.

1	(2)	Journey worker specialty electrician. Every applicant
2		to be eligible for the journey worker specialty
3		electrician examination shall be at least eighteen
4		years of age, shall provide satisfactory evidence of
5		having successfully completed an accredited academic
6		or apprenticeship program covering the principles of
7		electrical theory and the requirements of the National
8		Electric Code, and shall have had at least five years'
9		experience in the trade.
10	(3)	Supervising electrician. Every applicant to be
11		eligible for the supervising electrician examination
12		shall have been registered with the board as a journey
13		worker electrician for at least a period of four years
14		in the trade or shall have had equivalent experience
15		in the trade[-] and shall provide satisfactory
16		evidence of having successfully completed an associate
17		degree or certificate program or electrical
18		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
19		electrical theory and the requirements of the National
20		Electric Code.
21	(4)	Supervising specialty electrician. Every applicant to
22		be eligible for the supervising specialty electrician

1	examination shall have been registered with the board
2	as a journey worker specialty electrician for at least
3	a period of four years in the trade or shall have had
4	equivalent experience in the trade[\div] and shall
5	provide satisfactory evidence of having successfully
6	completed an accredited academic or apprenticeship
7	program covering the principles of electrical theory
8	and the requirements of the National Electric Code.
9 (5)	Journey worker plumber. Every applicant to be
10	eligible for the journey worker plumber examination
11	shall have had experience of at least five years'
12	full-time or its equivalent but not less than 10,000
13	hours as a journey worker's or master plumber's
14	helper, and is able to furnish satisfactory evidence
15	of such fact.
16 (6)	Master plumber. Every applicant to be eligible for
17	the master plumber examination shall have been
18	registered with the board as a journey worker plumber
19	for at least two years or shall have had equivalent
20	experience in the trade.
21 (7)	Maintenance electrician. Every applicant to be
22	eligible for the maintenance electrician examination

1		shall be not less than eighteen years of age, shall
2		provide satisfactory evidence of having successfully
3		completed an accredited academic or apprenticeship
4		program covering the principles of electrical theory
5		and the requirements of the National Electric Code,
6		and shall have had at least one year of experience in
7		performing electrical maintenance work or proof of two
8		years of schooling in the electrical trade.
9	(8)	Journey worker industrial electrician. Every
10		applicant to be eligible for the journey worker
11		industrial electrician examination shall be at least
12		eighteen years of age, shall provide satisfactory
13		evidence of having successfully completed an
14		accredited academic or apprenticeship program covering
15		the principles of electrical theory and the
16		requirements of the National Electric Code, and shall
17		have had experience in industrial electrical work of
18		at least five years full-time or its equivalent, but
19		not less than 10,000 hours.
20	(9)	Supervising industrial electrician. Every applicant
21		to be eligible for the supervising industrial
22		electrician examination shall have been registered

1	with the board as a journey worker industrial
2	electrician for a period of at least four years or
3	shall have had equivalent experience in the $trade[-]$
4	and shall provide satisfactory evidence of having
5	successfully completed an accredited academic or
6	apprenticeship program covering the principles of
7	electrical theory and the requirements of the National
8	Electric Code."
9	SECTION 2. Section 448E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended to read as follows:
11	[+]\$448E-5.5[+] Examination. (a) Every applicant shall
12	be examined and shall pass an examination to be eligible for
13	licensure. The board shall provide in its rules the passing
14	score for the examination. The board may examine applicants or
15	may contract with professional testing services to prepare,
16	administer, and grade the examination as may be required for the
17	purpose of this section.
18	(b) Every applicant shall pay an examination fee as
19	provided in rules adopted by the director pursuant to chapter
20	91. Should the board contract with a professional testing
21	agency to prepare, administer, and grade the examination, the

- 1 examination fee may be paid directly to the testing agency by
- 2 the director or the examinee.
- 3 (c) The examinations for all levels of electricians shall
- 4 test the applicant on the applicant's knowledge of the
- 5 principles of electrical theory and the requirements of the
- 6 National Electrical Code. The examinations shall test the
- 7 applicant at the level of knowledge gained through the
- 8 successful completion of an associate degree or certification
- 9 program in electrical theory or electrical apprenticeship from
- 10 an accredited institution."
- 11 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 15 begun, before its effective date.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
