A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRICAL LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 448E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§448E-5 Minimum requirements. An applicant shall possess
4	the following minimum qualifications:
5	(1) Journey worker electrician. Every applicant to be
6	eligible for the journey worker electrician
7	examination shall be at least eighteen years of age
8	and shall provide satisfactory evidence of:
9	(A) Successfully completing an accredited academic or
10	apprenticeship program covering the principles of
11	electrical theory and the requirements of the
12	National Electric Code; or
13	(B) At least five years of full-time experience in
14	residential or commercial wiring [of at least
15	five years full-time] or its equivalent, but [not
16	less] no fewer than [10,000] ten thousand hours
17	of experience in the trade under the supervision
18	of a journey worker or supervising electrician.

1	(2)	Jour	ney worker specialty electrician. Every applicant		
2		to be eligible for the journey worker specialty			
3		electrician examination shall be at least eighteen			
4		year	years of age and shall [have]:		
5		(A)	Provide satisfactory evidence of having		
6			successfully completed an accredited academic or		
7			apprenticeship program covering the principles of		
8			electrical theory and the requirements of the		
9			National Electric Code; or		
10		(B)	<u>Have</u> had at least five years' experience in the		
11			trade.		
12	(3)	Supe	rvising electrician. Every applicant to be		
13		elig	ible for the supervising electrician examination		
14		shall [have]:			
15		(A)	<pre>Have been registered with the board as a journey</pre>		
16			worker electrician for at least a period of four		
17			years in the trade or shall have had equivalent		
18			experience in the trade[.]; and		
19		(B)	Provide satisfactory evidence of having		
20			successfully completed an associate degree or		
21			certificate program or electrical apprenticeship		
22			program covering the principles of electrical		

1		theory and the requirements of the National
2		Electric Code.
3	(4)	Supervising specialty electrician. Every applicant to
4		be eligible for the supervising specialty electrician
5		examination shall [have]:
6		(A) Have been registered with the board as a journey
7		worker specialty electrician for at least a
8		period of four years [in the trade] or shall have
9		had equivalent experience in the trade $[\cdot]$; and
10		(B) Provide satisfactory evidence of having
11		successfully completed an accredited academic or
12		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
13		electrical theory and the requirements of the
14		National Electric Code.
15	(5)	Journey worker plumber. Every applicant to be
16		eligible for the journey worker plumber examination
17		shall have had at least five years of full-time
18		experience [of at least five years' full-time] or its
19		equivalent but [not less] no fewer than [10,000] ten
20		thousand hours as a journey worker's or master
21		plumber's helper, and $[\frac{is}{is}]$ be able to furnish
22		satisfactory evidence of such fact.

1	(6)	Master plumber. Every applicant to be eligible for
2		the master plumber examination shall have been
3		registered with the board as a journey worker plumber
4		for at least two years or shall have had equivalent
5		experience in the trade.
6	(7)	Maintenance electrician. Every applicant to be
7		eligible for the maintenance electrician examination
8		shall [be]:
9		(A) Be not less than eighteen years of age;
10		(B) Provide satisfactory evidence of having
11		successfully completed an accredited academic or
12		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
13		electrical theory and the requirements of the
14		National Electric Code; and [shall have]
15		(C) Have had at least one year of experience in
16		performing electrical maintenance work or proof
17		of two years of schooling in the electrical
18		trade.
19	(8)	Journey worker industrial electrician. Every
20		applicant to be eligible for the journey worker
21		industrial electrician examination shall $[be]$:
22		(A) Be at least eighteen years of age;

1		<u>(B)</u>	Provide satisfactory evidence of having
2			successfully completed an accredited academic or
3			apprenticeship program covering the principles of
4			electrical theory and the requirements of the
5			National Electric Code; and [shall have]
6		(C)	Have had least five years of full-time experience
7			in industrial electrical work [of at least five
8			years full-time] or its equivalent, but [not
9			less] no fewer than [10,000] ten thousand hours.
10	(9)	Supe	rvising industrial electrician. Every applicant
11		to b	e eligible for the supervising industrial
12		elec	trician examination shall [have]:
13		(A)	<u>Have</u> been registered with the board as a journey
14			worker industrial electrician for a period of at
15			least four years or shall have had equivalent
16			experience in the trade[-]; and
17		<u>(B)</u>	Provide satisfactory evidence of having
18			successfully completed an accredited academic or
19			apprenticeship program covering the principles of
20			electrical theory and the requirements of the
21			National Electric Code."

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 448E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+] \$448E-5.5[+] Examination. (a) Every applicant shall
- 4 be examined and shall pass an examination to be eligible for
- 5 licensure. The board shall provide in its rules the passing
- 6 score for the examination. The board may examine applicants or
- 7 may contract with professional testing services to prepare,
- 8 administer, and grade the examination as may be required for the
- 9 purpose of this section.
- 10 (b) Every applicant shall pay an examination fee as
- 11 provided in rules adopted by the director pursuant to chapter
- 12 91. Should the board contract with a professional testing
- 13 agency to prepare, administer, and grade the examination, the
- 14 examination fee may be paid directly to the testing agency by
- 15 the director or the examinee.
- 16 (c) The examinations for all levels of electricians shall
- 17 test the applicant on the applicant's knowledge of the
- 18 principles of electrical theory and the requirements of the
- 19 National Electrical Code. The examinations shall test the
- 20 applicant at the level of knowledge gained through the
- 21 successful completion of an associate degree or certification

- 1 program in electrical theory or electrical apprenticeship from
- 2 an accredited institution."
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun, before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
