A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE PHARMACY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 346-342, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 "[+]\$346-342[+] State pharmacy assistance program. 3 There is established within the department the state pharmacy 4 assistance program. Provided that there are no federally 5 approved prescription drug plans available in the State that 6 provide a full coverage prescription drug benefit, the state 7 pharmacy assistance program may coordinate the prescription drug 8 coverage with the federal medicare part D prescription drug 9 benefit, including related supplies, as determined by the 10 department, to each resident who meets the eligibility 11 requirements as outlined in section 346-343. 12 (b) The department [may] shall provide enrollment 13 assistance to eligible individuals [into the state pharmacy 14 assistance program. Enrollment for medicaid dual eligible 15 persons shall begin no later than October 1, 2005.] to identify 16 the medicare prescription drug plan that best meets the needs of 17 the enrollee at the lowest cost, based upon the enrollee's
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- 1 medication, pharmacy, and overall costs to the enrollee, and to
- 2 assist the enrollee in joining or changing plans.
- 3 (c) The department shall allow any willing prescription
- 4 drug plan approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and
- 5 Medicaid Services to provide the coordination of benefits
- 6 between the State's medicare prescription drug program and the
- 7 medicare part D drug benefit.
- 8 (d) The department may administer the state pharmacy
- 9 assistance program or contract with a third party or parties in
- 10 accordance with chapter 103F to administer any single component
- 11 or combination of components of the state pharmacy assistance
- 12 program, including outreach, eligibility, enrollment, claims,
- 13 administration, rebate negotiations and recovery, and
- 14 redistribution, in order to coordinate the prescription drug
- 15 benefits of the state pharmacy assistance program and the
- 16 federal medicare part D drug benefit.
- 17 (e) Any contract with third parties to administer any
- 18 component of the state pharmacy assistance program shall be
- 19 established either at no cost to the State[au] or on a
- 20 contingency-fee basis and with no up-front costs to the State,
- 21 as may be negotiated by the department.

1	(f) Any contract with third parties to administer any			
2	component of the state pharmacy assistance program shall			
3	prohibit the contractor from receiving any compensation or other			
4	benefits from any pharmaceutical manufacturer participating in			
5	the state pharmacy assistance program.			
6	[(g) A prescription drug manufacturer or labeler that			
7	sells prescription drugs in the State may enter into a rebate			
8	agreement with the department. The rebate agreement may be			
9	agreed upon by the manufacturer or the labeler to make rebate			
10	payments to the department each calendar quarter or according to			
11	a schedule established by the department.			
12	(h) The department or contractor may negotiate the amount			
13	of the rebate required from a manufacturer or labeler in			
14	accordance with this part.			
15	(i) The department or contractor may take into			
16	consideration the rebate calculated under the medicaid rebate			
17	program pursuant to Title 42 United States Code Section 1396r-8,			
18	the average wholesale price of prescription drugs, and any other			
19	cost data related to prescription drug prices and price			
20	discounts.			
21	(j) The department or contractor shall use their best			
22	efforts to obtain the best possible rebate amount.

- 2 assistance program as long as they receive pharmaceutical
- 3 benefits from that other public assistance program, unless the
- 4 applicant is eligible for medicare. Residents who qualify for,
- 5 or are enrolled in, the [+]Rx plus program[+] shall be eligible
- 6 for the state pharmacy assistance program; provided that they
- 7 meet all other state pharmacy assistance program requirements.
- 8 (c) State pharmacy assistance program applicants who are
- 9 enrolled in a private sector plan or insurance providing
- 10 payments for prescription drugs shall be ineligible to receive
- 11 benefits from the state pharmacy assistance program.
- (d) State pharmacy assistance program applicants shall
- 13 apply for the federal medicare part D pharmacy benefit program,
- 14 apply for and accept all subsidies available under the medicare
- 15 part D pharmacy drug benefit, and authorize the department to
- 16 request eligibility, coverage, and formulary exceptions on the
- 17 beneficiary's behalf and to appeal adverse determinations
- 18 relating to medicare prescription drug plan enrollment,
- 19 eligibility, subsidy eligibility and benefit levels, coverage,
- 20 and formulary exceptions."
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 346-344, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:

21	SECT	SECTION 5. Section 346-341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
22	amended by deleting the definitions of "asset test", "full				

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coverage prescription drug benefit", and "liquid assets" to 1 2 read: [""Asset test" means the asset limits for eligibility in 3 the state pharmacy assistance program as defined by the Medicare 4 Modernization Act and any amendments thereto. 5 "Full coverage prescription drug benefit" means a federally 6 approved prescription drug plan that offers a zero co-payment 7 benefit for medicaid dual eligibles under the medicare part D 8 9 drug benefit. "Liquid assets" means assets used in the eligibility 10 determination process as defined by the Medicare Modernization 11 12 Act."] SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 15

Description:

Extends income eligibility requirement to 200% of the federal poverty level.
