A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY RELIEF FOR NATURAL DISASTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

11	SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
2	immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
3	the Hawaii State Constitution.
4	SECTION 2. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
5	to:
6	(1) Cover the costs of recovery efforts that are the
7	result of storms that occurred in February and March
8	2006; and
9	(2) Hire consultants to:
10	(A) Determine the structural integrity of dams and
11	reservoirs statewide;
12	(B) Assess potential immediate risks; and
13	(C) Recommend long-term plans to ensure dam safety.
14	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2005-2006 for staff
17	expenses and to hire consultants to assess the impact existing



- 1 dams and reservoirs have on agricultural operations and the
- 2 impact if existing dams and reservoirs were removed.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2005-2006 for
- 8 overtime, travel and other staff expenses, and to hire
- 9 consultants and experts to review legal issues related to dam
- 10 and reservoir failures and issues relating to the safety of
- 11 existing dams and reservoirs. Funds may also be used for
- 12 expenses related to possible litigation concerning dam and
- 13 reservoir failures.
- 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 15 the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2005-2006 to cover
- 19 operational expenses associated with storm recovery efforts,
- 20 including but not limited to state civil defense twenty-
- 21 four-hour emergency operations center overtime costs expended by
- 22 civil defense workers, contractors that are helping to pump

- 1 reservoirs to maintain safer water levels, National Guard
- 2 personnel on state active-duty status, and Blackhawk helicopter
- 3 operating expenses.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 defense for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2005-2006 for staff
- 9 expenses and to hire consultants to conduct surveys, studies and
- 10 assessments of private and government owned dams and reservoirs
- 11 statewide to determine their current physical integrity.
- 12 Assessments shall include recommendations for future structural
- 13 needs and identification of potential effects or threats to
- 14 areas around and downstream of the dams and reservoirs.
- 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act;
- 17 provided that of the \$5,000,000 appropriated, \$ or so
- 18 much thereof as may be necessary shall be used to repair the
- 19 breach at Ka Loko reservoir on Kauai and relocate the spillway.
- 20 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$284,000 or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2005-2006 for staff

- 1 expenses and to hire consultants to respond to and assess flood
- 2 damage at state parks and on state lands.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the state highway
- 6 fund the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 7 necessary for fiscal year 2005-2006 for staff and other
- 8 expenses, including equipment rentals, and to hire contractors
- 9 and consultants for repair of road damage and stabilization of
- 10 road embankments on Kuhio Highway, Kauai.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the state highway
- 14 fund the sum of \$800,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary,
- 15 for fiscal year 2005-2006 and out of federal funds the sum of
- 16 \$3,200,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 17 year 2005-2006 for a capital improvement project to design and
- 18 construct emergency roadway erosion remediation at various
- 19 locations on Kauai damaged by the storms in February and March
- 20 2006. Work shall include:
- 21 (1) Installing temporary and permanent erosion control
- 22 measures;

1	(2)	Restoring roadways, shoulders, and utility	
2		improvements;	
3	(3)	Installing guardrails and shoulder stabilization	
4	measures;		
5	(4)	Installing retaining walls;	
6	(5)	Upgrading drainage structures; and	
7	(6)	Installing other miscellaneous improvements.	
8	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
9	of transportation for the purposes of this Act.		
10	SECTION 10. Each department or agency expending funds		
11	authorized by this Act shall submit reports to the legislature		
12	no later	than July 15, 2006; January 15, 2007; and July 15,	
13	2007. Th	e information contained in the reports shall:	
14	(1)	Be organized by county;	
15	(2)	Provide summaries of expenditure data on a statewide	
16	basis; and		
17	(3)	Include but not be limited to:	
18		(A) The date of each expenditure;	
19		(B) The purpose and a description of each	
20		expenditure;	
21		(C) The identification of any recipient of payments	
22		from each expenditure; and	

1	(D) If funds not authorized by this Act are used by			
2	any department or agency for the purposes of this			
3	Act:			
4	4 (i) The source	of those funds, by specific		
5	5 program;			
6	6 (ii) The impact	to the programs originally funded		
7	7 by those fu	nds; and		
8	8 (iii) The need fo	r any emergency appropriations		
9	9 that result	ed from the diversion of those		
10	funds.			
11	SECTION 11. The reports required from the department of			
12	land and natural resources under section 10 of this Act shall			
13	also contain progress reports that include:			
14	(1) A list of dams for which inspections have been			
15	completed;			
16	6 (2) A list of dams that a	(2) A list of dams that are currently in the process of		
17	being inspected; and			
18	(3) A list of dams that have not yet been inspected.			
19	9 SECTION 12. Any provision	of this Act to the contrary		
20	notwithstanding, the appropriations authorized under this Act			
21	shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the			
22	appropriations were made. All unexpended and unencumbered			

- ${f 1}$ balances of the appropriations made in this Act as of the close
- 2 of business on June 30, 2007, shall lapse.
- 3 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
