HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO APPLY FOR APPORTIONED FEDERAL FUNDING TO ESTABLISH A SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM IN HAWAII AND TO RECRUIT AND HIRE A FULL-TIME COORDINATOR FOR THE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Safe Routes to School program was established under the federal Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient, Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users, in order to:

- (1) Enable and encourage children, including those with disabilities, to walk and bicycle to school;
- (2) Make bicycling and walking to school a safer and more appealing transportation alternative, thereby encouraging a healthy and active lifestyle from an early age; and
- (3) Facilitate the planning, development, and implementation of projects and activities that will improve safety and reduce traffic, fuel consumption, and air pollution in the vicinity of schools; and

WHEREAS, the federal share of the Safe Routes to School program is one hundred per cent; and

WHEREAS, a total of \$100,000,000 in federal funds is available in 2006 to be apportioned among the states to implement Safe Routes to School programs according to the proportion of a state's total student enrollment in primary and middle schools to the total student enrollment in all states, but not less than \$2,000,000 for a fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, available federal funding to the states for the Safe Routes to School program will escalate from \$125,000,000 in 2007 to \$183,000,000 in 2009; and

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WHEREAS, these federal funds may be used for the planning, 1 design, and construction of infrastructure-related projects that 2 will substantially improve the ability of students to walk and 3 bicycle to school, including: 4 5 (1)Sidewalk improvements; 6 7 Traffic calming and speed reduction improvements; (2) 8 9 Pedestrian and bicycle crossing improvements; (3) 10 11 (4) On-street bicycle facilities; 12 13 (5) Off-street bicycle and pedestrian facilities; 14 15 Secure bicycle parking facilities; and (6) 16 17 Traffic diversion improvements in the vicinity of (7)18 schools; and 19 20 WHEREAS, federal funds may also be used for non-21 infrastructure-related activities to encourage walking and 22 bicycling to school, including: 23 24 Public awareness campaigns and outreach to press and 25 (1)community leaders; 26 27 Traffic education and enforcement in the vicinity of (2) 28 schools; 29 30 Student sessions on bicycling and pedestrian safety, (3) 31 health, and environment; and 32 33 Training, volunteers, and managers of Safe Routes to (4)34 School programs; and 35 36 WHEREAS, each state receiving apportioned federal funding 37 is required to use a sufficient amount of its grant to fund a 38 full-time coordinator position for a state's Safe Routes to 39 School program, thus providing a central point of contact for a 40

of 2006, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Transportation is encouraged to apply for apportioned federal funding to establish a Safe Routes to School program in Hawaii and to recruit and hire a full-time coordinator for the program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is requested to report to the Legislature the progress of its application for federal funding to establish a Safe Routes to School program in Hawaii and of its recruitment and hiring of a full-time coordinator for the program no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2007; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Transportation, the Superintendent of Education, and Chairperson of the Board of Education.
