A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COURT APPOINTED COUNSEL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Act 86, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is amended 2 by amending section 1 to read as follows: 3 "SECTION 1. Section 802-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "§802-5 Appointment of counsel; compensation. (a) it shall appear to a judge that a person requesting the 7 appointment of counsel satisfies the requirements of this 8 chapter, the judge shall appoint counsel to represent the person 9 at all stages of the proceedings, including appeal, if any. 10 conflicting interests exist, or if the interests of justice require, the court may appoint private counsel, who shall 11 12 receive reasonable compensation for necessary expenses, 13 including travel, the amount of which shall be determined by the
- 14 court, and reasonable fees pursuant to subsection (b). All
- 15 expenses and fees shall be ordered by the court. Duly ordered
- 16 payment shall be made upon vouchers approved by the director of
- 17 finance and warrants drawn by the comptroller.

1	(b) The court shall determine the amount of reasonable		
2	compensation to appointed counsel, based on the rate of \$90 an		
3	hour; provided that the maximum allowable fee shall not exceed		
4	the follo	wing schedule:	
5	(1)	Any felony case	\$6,000
6	(2)	Misdemeanor case - jury trial	3,000
7	(3)	Misdemeanor case - jury waived	1,500
8	(4)	Appeals [to the intermediate

11	(6)	Any other type of administrative	
12		or judicial proceeding, including	
13		cases arising under section	
14		571-11(1), 571-14(a)(1), or

16	Payment in excess of any maximum provided for under		
17	paragraphs (1) to (6) may be made whenever the court in which		
18	the representation was rendered certifies that the amount of the		
19	excess payment is necessary to provide fair compensation and the		
20	payment is approved by the administrative judge of that court.		
21	(c)	The public defender and the judiciary shall	l submit to
22	the department of budget and finance for inclusion in the		

- 1 department's budget request for each fiscal biennium, the amount
- 2 required for each fiscal year for the payment of fees and
- 3 expenses pursuant to this section.""

- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
