A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DERELICT VEHICLE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the current criteria
2	for classifying a vehicle parked on a public roadway as a
3	derelict vehicle does not allow for the efficient disposal of
4	such vehicles. It also does not comply with the holding in Wong
5	v. City and County of Honolulu, 333 F. Sup. 2d 942 (D. Hawaii
6	2004), in which United States District Court Senior Judge Alan
7	C. Kay ruled that disposing of a vehicle deemed derelict under
8	current law because it is ten model years or older, without
9	providing notice to the owner, violates procedural due process.
10	The purpose of this Act is to permit the fair and efficient
11	removal and disposal of derelict vehicles by deleting the
12	references to "previous registration" and to "ten model years
13	and older" vehicles from the definition of a derelict vehicle in
14	section 290-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes. This Act also changes
15	the references to the Housing and Community Development
16	Corporation of Hawaii to the Hawaii Public Housing
17	Administration.

1	SECT	ION 2. Section 290-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

20	(3)	The vehicle identification number and license plates	
21		have been removed so as to nullify efforts to locate	
22		or identify the current registered and legal owners;

The vehicle has not been registered for the current 1 (4)[or previous] registration periods; or 2 The vehicle registration records of the county 3 (5) director of finance contain no record that the vehicle has ever been registered in the county [; or]5 (6) The vehicle is ten model years old or older]. 6 Prior to authorizing the removal of a derelict vehicle, the 7 administrative head of the county agency designated to carry out 8 section 290-1, or the executive director or a representative of 9 the executive director of [the housing and community development 10 corporation of Hawaii] the Hawaii public housing administration 11 in the case of vehicles $[\frac{which}{}]$ that have been abandoned on 12 property owned, managed, or operated by the [corporation,] 13 administration, shall notify the county chief of police only if 14 the vehicle is reported stolen or otherwise needed for police 15 16 investigation." SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006. 19
