A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE I OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII RELATING TO SEXUAL ASSAULT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an
amendment to article I of the Constitution of the State of
Hawaii to provide that the legislature may define what behavior
constitutes a continuing course of conduct in continuous sexual
assault crimes against minors younger than fourteen years of age
and what constitutes the jury unanimity that is required for a
conviction.

Under current Hawaii law, it is difficult to prosecute

Under current Hawaii law, it is difficult to prosecute those who repeatedly sexually assault a child, because of the difficulty young children have in remembering the individual dates on which they were sexually assaulted. This amendment would allow the legislature to enact a law that would permit juries to convict a person of the continuous sexual assault of a minor younger than fourteen years of age, if each member of the jury was convinced beyond a reasonable doubt that the defendant had sexually assaulted the child the required number of times (such as three), even if there were not unanimity as to the

- 3 The legislature passed such a law in 1997, but that law was
- 4 invalidated by the Hawaii supreme court. An amendment similar
- 5 to this amendment was proposed to the voters in 2004 and the
- 6 amendment was invalidated by the Hawaii supreme court.
- 7 SECTION 2. Article I of the Constitution of the State of
- 8 Hawaii is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately
- 9 designated and to read as follows:

10 "SEXUAL ASSAULT CRIMES AGAINST MINORS

- 11 Section . In continuous sexual assault crimes against
- 12 minors younger than fourteen years of age, the legislature may
- 13 define:
- 14 (1) What behavior constitutes a continuing course of
- 15 conduct; and
- 16 (2) What constitutes the jury unanimity that is required
- for a conviction."
- 18 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
- 19 be as follows:
- 20 "Shall the Constitution of the State of Hawaii be amended
