A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOLICITATION OF FUNDS FOR CHARITABLE PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 467B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§467B-</u> Professional solicitors; required disclosures.
5	A professional solicitor who makes an oral solicitation by
6	telephone, door-to-door, or otherwise shall furnish to each
7	contributor, prior to collecting or attempting to collect any
8	contribution, a written confirmation of the expected
9	contribution, containing the following information clearly and
10	conspicuously:
11	(1) The full legal name, address, and telephone number of
12	the individual professional solicitor who directly
13	communicated with the contributor; and
14	(2) A disclosure that the contribution is not
15	tax-deductible, if applicable, or, if the professional
16	solicitor maintains that the contribution is tax-
17	deductible in whole or in part, the portion of the

1	contribution that the professional solicitor maintains
2	is tax-deductible."
3	SECTION 2. Section 467B-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending the definitions of "contribution",
5	"professional fund-raising counsel" or "professional fundraising
6	counsel", and "professional solicitor" to read as follows:
7	""Contribution" means the promise or grant of any money or
8	property of any kind or value, including the promise to pay,
9	except payments by members of a charitable organization for
10	membership fees, dues, fines, or assessments, or for services
11	rendered to individual members, if membership in the charitable
12	organization confers a bona fide right, privilege, professional
13	standing, honor, or other direct benefit, other than the right
14	to vote, elect officers, or hold offices, and except money or
15	property received from any governmental authority $[\cdot]$, or a grant
16	or subsidy from any organization exempt from taxation under
17	Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
18	"Professional fund-raising counsel" or "professional
19	fundraising counsel" means any person who, for [a fee,]
20	compensation, plans, conducts, manages, [carries on,] advises,
21	consults, or [acts as a consultant, whether directly or
22	indirectly, in connection with soliciting prepares material

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for, or with respect to, the solicitation of contributions in
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    this state for [or on behalf of any] a charitable organization,
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    but who actually solicits no contributions as a part of the
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    person's services [-], and who does not employ, procure, or
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    engage any compensated person to solicit contributions. The
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    term [includes] shall not include a bona fide volunteer,
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    salaried officer, or employee of a charitable organization [if
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    the bona fide volunteer, salaried officer, or employee of the
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    charitable organization receives percentage compensation].
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         "Professional solicitor" means any person who, for a
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    financial or other consideration, solicits contributions in this
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    state for [or on behalf of] a charitable organization[-], or any
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    person with whom the professional solicitor independently
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    contracts to solicit for contributions. A person who is
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    otherwise a professional fundraising counsel shall be deemed a
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    professional solicitor if the person's compensation is related
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    to the amount of contributions received. The term does not
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    include a bona fide volunteer. The term includes a [bona fide
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    \frac{\text{volunteer}_{\tau}}{\text{volunteer}_{\tau}} salaried officer[\tau] or employee of a charitable
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    organization if the [bona fide volunteer,] salaried officer[,]
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    or employee of the charitable organization receives percentage
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    compensation. The term does not include an attorney, investment
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1	counselor or advisor, financial advisor, or banker, or other		
2	person who:		
3	(1) Advises another person to make a contribution to a		
4	charitable organization as part of the person's		
5	employment; and		
6	(2) Does not receive compensation from the charitable		
7	organization for that advice."		
8	SECTION 3. Section 467B-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
10	"(a) Within ninety days after a solicitation campaign or		
11	event has been completed and on the anniversary of the		
12	commencement of a solicitation campaign lasting more than one		
13	year, a professional solicitor shall file with the attorney		
14	general a financial report for the campaign, including gross		
15	revenue and an itemization of all expenses incurred. This		
16	report shall be signed [and sworn to] under penalty provided by		
17	section 710-1063 by the authorized contracting agent for the		
18	professional solicitor and two authorized officials of the		
19	charitable organization. A professional solicitor shall		
20	maintain during each solicitation campaign and for not less tha		
21	three years after the completion of that campaign the following		

1	records, wh	hich shall be available for inspection upon demand by
2	the attorne	ey general:
3	(1)	The date and amount of each contribution received and
4		the name and address of each contributor;
5	(2)	The name and residence of each employee, agent, or
6		other person involved in the solicitation;
7	(3)	Records of all revenue received and expenses incurred
8		in the course of the solicitation campaign; and
9	(4)	The location and account number of each bank or other
10		financial institution account in which the

13	SECTIO	ON 4. Section 467B-9.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended as	follows:

18	organizatio	on, professional fundraising counsel, or professional
19	solicitor v	whenever the attorney general finds that a charitable
20	organizatio	on, professional fundraising counsel, or professional
21	solicitor,	or an agent, servant, or employee thereof:

1	(1)	Has violated or is operating in violation of lany
2		provision of this chapter, the rules of the attorney
3		general, or an order issued by the attorney general;
4	(2)	Has refused or failed, after notice, to produce any
5		records of the organization or to disclose any
6		information required to be disclosed under this
7		chapter or the rules of the attorney general; [ex]
8	(3)	Has made a material false statement in an application
9		statement, or report required to be filed under this
10		chapter[-]; or
11	(4)	Has failed to file the financial report required by
12		section 467B-2.5, or filed an incomplete financial
13		report."
14	2.	By amending subsection (c) to read:
15	"(C)	[All actions of the attorney general shall be taken
16	subject t	o the right of notice, hearing, and adjudication and
17	the right	of appeal therefrom in accordance with chapter 91.
18	Any perso	n aggrieved by an action of the attorney general under
19	this sect	ion may request a hearing to review that action in
20	accordanc	e with chapter 91 and rules adopted by the attorney
21	general.	Any request for hearing shall be made within ten days
22	after the	attorney general has served the person with notice of

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the action, which notice shall be deemed effective upon
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    mailing."
         SECTION 5. Section 467B-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§467B-12 Filing requirements for professional fundraising
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    counsel and professional solicitors. (a) Every professional
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    fundraising counsel or professional solicitor, prior to any
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    solicitation, shall [file a registration statement] register
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    with the department. The registration statement shall be [in
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    writing under oath or affirmation] in the form prescribed by the
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    attorney general and shall contain the information as the
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    attorney general may require. The registration statement shall
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    be accompanied by a fee in the amount of $250, or in the amount
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    and with any additional sums as may be prescribed by the
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    attorney general. The statement shall list the names [\tau] and
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    addresses[, and social security numbers] of all owners,
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    officers, [agents, servants, employees,] and directors[, and
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    independent contractors of a professional fundraising counsel,
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    and the names [\tau] and addresses [\tau] and social security numbers of
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    all owners, officers, [agents, servants, employees,] and
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    directors[, and independent contractors] of a professional
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    solicitor. Renewal statements shall be filed with the
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- 1 department on or before July 1 of each calendar year [in which
- 2 the] by each professional fundraising counsel or professional
- 3 solicitor [does business in or from the State] and shall be
- 4 effective until June 30 of the next calendar year. The renewal
- 5 statement shall be in a form prescribed by the attorney general.
- 6 A renewal fee of \$250, or in any amount and with any additional
- 7 sums as may be prescribed by the attorney general, shall
- 8 accompany the renewal statement.
- 9 (b) The professional fundraising counsel or professional
- 10 solicitor, at the time of each filing, shall file with and have
- 11 approved by the attorney general a bond in which the applicant
- 12 is the principal obligor in the penal sum of \$25,000 issued with
- 13 good and sufficient surety or sureties approved by the attorney
- 14 general and which shall remain in effect for one year. The bond
- 15 shall inure to the benefit of the State, conditioned that the
- 16 applicant, its officers, directors, employees, agents, servants,
- 17 and independent contractors shall not violate this chapter. A
- 18 partnership or corporation that is a professional fundraising
- 19 counsel or professional solicitor may file a consolidated bond
- 20 on behalf of all its members, officers, and employees.
- 21 (c) The attorney general shall examine each registration
- 22 statement and supporting document filed by a professional

fundraising counsel or professional solicitor and shall 1 determine whether the registration requirements are satisfied. 2 If the attorney general determines that the registration 3 requirements are not satisfied, the attorney general shall 4 notify the professional fundraising counsel or professional 5 solicitor in writing within fifteen business days of its receipt 6 of the registration statement; otherwise the registration 7 statement is deemed to be approved. Within seven business days 8 after receipt of a notification that the registration 9 requirements are not satisfied, the professional fundraising 10 counsel or professional solicitor may request a hearing. 11 (d) The attorney general may adopt rules to provide for: 12 The extension of filing deadlines; (1)13 (2) The online availability of forms required to be filed; 14 (3) The electronic filing of required registration 15 statements, contracts, forms, and reports; and 16 The acceptance of electronic signatures." 17 (4) SECTION 6. Section 467B-12.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 19 "(a) There shall be a written contract between a 20 charitable organization and a professional fundraising counsel 21

or professional solicitor that shall be filed by the

1	profession	nal fundraising counsel or professional solicitor with	
2	the attorney general at least ten business days prior to the		
3	performance by the professional fundraising counsel or		
4	professio	nal solicitor of any service. No solicitation or	
5	service pursuant to the contract shall begin before the contract		
6	is filed with the attorney general. The contract shall be		
7	signed by two authorized officials of the charitable		
8	organization, one of whom shall be a member of the		
9	organization's governing body, and the authorized contracting		
10	officer for the professional fundraising counsel or professional		
11	solicitor. The contract shall contain all of the following		
12	provisions:		
13	(1)	The legal name and address of the charitable	
14		organization;	
15	(2)	A statement of the charitable purpose for which the	
16		solicitation campaign is being conducted;	
17	(3)	A statement of the respective obligations of the	
18		professional fundraising counsel or professional	
19		solicitor and the charitable organization;	
20	(4)	A statement of the guaranteed minimum percentage of	
21		the gross receipts from contributions that will be	

remitted to or retained by the charitable

1		organization, if any, or, if the solicitation involves
2		the sale of goods, services, or tickets to a
3		fundraising event, the percentage of the purchase
4		price that will be remitted to the charitable
5		organization, if any. The stated percentage shall
6		exclude any amount that the charitable organization is
7		to pay as fundraising costs;
8	(5)	Information concerning the compensation of the
9		professional solicitor and fundraising counsel as
10		follows:
11		(A) If the compensation of the professional
12		fundraising counsel or professional solicitor is
13		contingent upon the number of contributions or
14		the amount of revenue received, a statement shall
15		be included specifying the percentage of the
16		gross revenue that is the basis for that
17		compensation. The stated percentage shall
18		include any amount that the professional
19		fundraising counsel or professional solicitor is
20		to be reimbursed for fundraising costs;
21		(B) If the compensation of the professional solicitor
22		is not contingent upon the number of

1	contributions or amount of revenue received from
2	the solicitation campaign, the compensation shall
3	be expressed as a reasonable estimate of the
4	percentage of the gross revenue, and the contract
5	shall clearly disclose the assumptions upon which
6	the estimate is based. The stated assumptions
7	shall be based upon all of the relevant facts
8	known to the professional solicitor regarding the
9	solicitation to be conducted by the professional
10	solicitor; or
11	(C) If the compensation of the fundraising counsel is
12	not contingent on the number of contributions or
13	amount of revenue received from the solicitation
14	campaign, the compensation shall be stated in a
15	dollar amount;
16 (6)	The effective and termination dates of the contract
17	or, if the contract does not have a set termination
18	date, a clause allowing either party a reasonable

period to terminate the contract or notify the other

contract shall also contain the date services will

party if either party chooses not to renew.

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

Charitable Funds; Solicitation



Description:

Requires professional solicitors to disclose to contributors whether a donation will be tax deductible and solicitors' full legal name, address and phone number. Adopts clarifying amendments to the definitions of "contribution," "professional fund-raising counsel," and "professional solicitor." Allows the attorney general to suspend or revoke any registration where the registrant has failed to file, or filed an incomplete financial report as required. (SB2248 HD1)
