RELATING TO PROTECTION OF FOREST RESERVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I.

1 Fines under this section shall not be imposed on persons exercising native Hawaiian gathering rights or 2 3 traditional cultural practices. 4 The department shall submit an annual report outlining 5 the revenues generated by the penalties to the legislature at 6 least twenty days before each regular session." 7 SECTION 2. Section 183-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "\$183-18 [{Penalty.}] Criminal penalties. Any person who **10** violates section 183-17, upon conviction thereof, is guilty of a 11 misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than [\$1,000] \$2,000 or 12 imprisoned not more than one year, or both. In addition to any other penalty imposed under this section, a fine of up to \$2,000 13 14 shall be levied for each tree illegally destroyed or harvested 15 under section 183-17." 16 PART II. 17 SECTION 3. The legislature finds that the current statute 18 requires that income from the harvest and sale of certain forest 19 products and tree seedlings of the forest reserves be deposited 20 into the forest stewardship fund, but provides that "other 21 moneys accrued from any forest reserve or the products thereof"

be deposited into the general fund.

15	begun, before its effective date.

17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
