## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The ahupua`a of Ha`ena is the westernmost land
3	in the moku of Halele`a on the northwest coast of Kauai. The
4	public highway ends in this ahupua`a, a land filled with many
5	wahi pana or storied places, sites that are sacred to native
6	Hawaiians and important to the whole state. The ahupua`a of
7	Ha`ena and its offshore waters, since time immemorial, have been
8	an important subsistence fishery resource for native Hawaiians
9	and local families of the ahupua`a. However, the beauty of the
10	land and sea and the proximity to the end of the public highway
11	in the ahupua`a of Ha`ena attract hundreds of thousands of
12	visitors to the area every year. As a result of this influx of
13	visitors and a growing problem of indiscriminate fishing
14	practices, there has been an adverse impact to the fish stocks
15	and the integrity of the coral reef habitats in the area.
16	The legislature finds that a traditionally managed fishery
17	wherein the inhabitants of the ahupua`a develop and assist in

1	developme	nt and enforcement of traditional regulations for the			
2	maintenan	ce of the fishery is needed for the ahupua`a of Ha`ena			
3	The purpose of this Act is to establish a community-based				
4	subsisten	ce fishing area in the ahupua`a of Ha`ena.			
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
6	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately				
7	designated and to read as follows:				
8	" <u>§18</u>	8- Ha`ena community-based subsistence fishing area;			
9	restricti	ons; regulations. (a) There is designated the Ha`ena			
10	community-based subsistence fishing area on the northwestern				
11	coast of Kauai, which shall consist of all state waters and				
12	submerged	lands bounded by:			
13	(1)	The shoreline of the Haena district;			
14	(2)	A line that follows an imaginary extension of the			
15		boundary between Hae`na state park and Na Pali state			
16		park that extends seaward for one mile from the			
17		shoreline;			
18	(3)	An irregular line one mile offshore that is parallel			
19		to the contours of the shoreline; and			
20	(4)	A line that follows an imaginary extension of the			
21		boundary between Hae'na and Wainiha, as specified in			

1		the tax map of the county of Kauai, that extends			
2		seaward for one mile from the shoreline.			
3	(b)	In addition to the provisions of this chapter, the			
4	following	uses or activities shall be regulated in the Ha`ena			
5	community-based subsistence fishing area:				
6	(1)	Any activities with a commercial purpose, as defined			
7		in section 187A-1;			
8	(2)	The issuance of any commercial marine license, as			
9		defined in section 187A-1;			
10	(3)	The issuance of any aquarium fish permits, pursuant to			
11		section 188-31;			
12	(4)	Fishing with the use of gill nets;			
13	(5)	Fishing with self-contained underwater breathing			
14		apparatus and spears; and			
15	(6)	Any other use or activity that the department of land			
16		and natural resources, in consultation with the			
17		inhabitants of the ahupua`a of Ha`ena and other			
18		interested parties, deems appropriate.			
19	(c)	The department of land and natural resources, as soon			
20	as practi	cal, shall consult with as broad a base as possible,			
21	group of	inhabitants of the ahupua`a of Ha`ena and other			
22	interested parties to establish rules for the Ha`ena				

1	community-based subsistence fishing area, to include but not be					
2	<pre>limited to:</pre>					
3	(1)	A determination of fishing practices that are				
4		customarily and traditionally exercised for purposes				
5		of native Hawaiian subsistence, culture, and religion				
6		in the fishing area;				
7	(2)	A management plan recognizing existing marine				
8		activities permitted by the department of land and				
9		natural resources and containing a description of				
10		specific activities to be conducted in the fishing				
11		area, including evaluation and monitoring processes				
12		and methods of funding and enforcement;				
13	(3)	Limits on the harvest of aquatic life, as those terms				
14		are defined in section 187A-1, in the fishing area;				
15	(4)	The establishment of no harvesting zones within the				
16		fishing area without depriving ahupua`a inhabitants of				
17		access to traditional sources of subsistence; and				
18	(5)	A process for the expansion of the fishing area to				
19		include other ahupua`a.				
20	The	department of land and natural resources shall adopt				
21	rules pur	suant to chapter 91 necessary for the purpose of this				
22	section."					

1	PART II
2	SECTION 3. The legislature finds that the department of
3	land and natural resources is in the process of adopting rules
4	regulating user conflicts in Kahului harbor and upon the
5	adoption of the rules, the provision of Act 218, Session Laws of
6	Hawaii 2005, will be unnecessary. The legislature further finds
7	that the rule making process should be completed prior to June
8	2007.
9	The purpose of this part is to extend the effective date of
10	Act 218, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, to allow the department of
11	land and natural resources time to adopt necessary rules prior
12	to June 2007.
13	SECTION 4. Act 218, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is
14	amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:
15	"SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on [December 31,
16	2006.] June 30, 2007; provided that this Act shall be repealed
17	upon the effective date of administrative rules adopted by the
18	department of land and natural resources regarding user
19	conflicts at Kahului harbor; and provided further that upon
20	repeal of this Act, section 188-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
21	shall be reenacted in the form in which it read on the day
22	before the effective date of this Act."

Extends the effective date of the statutory prohibition against net fishing in Kahului Harbor to 6/30/07 and repeals the statutory prohibition upon the adoption of rules by DLNR regulating user conflicts in the harbor.
