A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR HEALTHY START.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Hawaii's healthy start program began in July
2	1985 as a demonstration child abuse program that supported at-
3	risk families with newborns through home visits. It is now a
4	statewide program that identifies and assesses high-risk
5	children at birth and monitors their growth and development with
6	home visits through the age of three. By identifying high-risk
7	families before abuse or neglect can begin and providing home
8	visits and services, healthy start helps these families to steer
9	clear from the risks of violence. Home visits by trained
10	paraprofessionals help reduce the risk of child maltreatment and
11	provide parents with information and access to programs that
12	foster child health and development, positive parenting skills,
13	and problem-solving techniques. In addition, healthy start
14	provides parents with links to medical care, job training,
15	housing applications, crisis intervention, and other support.
16	Parents enrolled in healthy start also enjoy more positive
17	parent-child interactions, have a more positive attitude toward

their children, and demonstrate better nonviolent discipline.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the

- 4 neglect.
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1, or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
- 8 Hawaii's healthy start program to continue to serve and support
- 9 high-risk families.
- 10 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 11 department of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
