A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE PHARMACY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 346-342, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
3	"(a) There is established within the department the state
4	pharmacy assistance program. Provided that there are no
5	federally approved prescription drug plans available in the
6	[State] state that provide a full coverage prescription drug
7	benefit, the state pharmacy assistance program may coordinate
8	the prescription drug coverage with the federal medicare part D
9	prescription drug benefit, including related supplies, as
10	determined by the department, to each resident who meets the
11	eligibility requirements as outlined in section $346-343$. The
12	state pharmacy assistance program shall be qualified by the
13	federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
14	(b) The department $[\frac{may}{shall}]$ provide enrollment
15	assistance to eligible individuals [into the state pharmacy
16	assistance program. Enrollment for medicaid dual eligible
17 ₁	persons shall begin no later than October 1, 2005. to identify
18	the medicare prescription drug plan that best meets the needs of

the enrollee at the lowest cost, based upon the enrollee's 1 medication, pharmacy, and overall costs to the enrollee, and to 2 assist the enrollee in joining or changing plans." 3 SECTION 2. Section 346-343, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 5 "(a) All residents of the [State] state shall be eligible 6 to participate in the state pharmacy assistance program; 7 8 provided that the applicant: Is a resident of Hawaii; 9 (1)Is sixty-five years or older, or is disabled and 10 (2)receiving a social security benefit; 11 Has a household income at or below one hundred fifty 12 (3) per cent of the federal poverty level; 13 Meets the asset test; and 14 (4)Is not a member of a retirement plan who is receiving (5) 15 a benefit from the Medicare Modernization Act. 16 State pharmacy assistance program applicants who are (b) 17 enrolled in any other public assistance program providing 18 pharmaceutical benefits, other than the Medicare Modernization 19 $Act[\tau]$ and medicaid, shall be ineligible for the state pharmacy **20**

assistance program as long as they receive pharmaceutical

benefits from that other public assistance program, unless the

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1	applicant is eligible for medicare. Residents who qualify for,		
2	or are en	rolled in, the $[+]$ Rx plus program $[+]$ shall be eligible	
3	for the s	tate pharmacy assistance program; provided that they	
4	meet all	other state pharmacy assistance program requirements."	
5	SECT	ION 3. Section 346-344, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
6	amended to	o read as follows:	
7	"[+]	§346-344[] Benefits. (a) For persons meeting the	
8	eligibili	ty requirements in section 346-343[$_{ au}$] with household	
9	incomes o	f not more than one hundred fifty per cent of the	
10	<u>federal</u> p	overty level, the state pharmacy assistance program	
11	[may pay	all or some of the co-payments required under the	
12	federal m	edicare part D pharmacy benefit program, subject to	
13	receipt o	f sufficient rebates pursuant to section 346-342(g), as	
14	determine	d by the department.] may pay:	
15	(1)	As to prescriptions covered by the medicare	
16		prescription drug benefit, all enrollee costs,	
17		including deductibles and copayments;	
18	(2)	As to classes of medication excluded from coverage by	
19		the medicare prescription drug benefit, all enrollee	
20		costs, subject to the current coverage for these	
21		classes of drugs under the medicaid fee-for-service	
22		program; and	

1	(3)	As to a prescription that has been defiled coverage by
2		the medicare prescription drug plan because the
3		pharmaceutical is not on the plan's formulary, all
4		enrollee costs, if the department determines that
5		alternative medications available from the medicare
6		prescription drug plan would be less effective than
7		the prescribed medication or unsafe. The department
8		may seek reimbursement from the medicare prescription
9		drug plan, request a medicare part D formulary
10		exception, and appeal any adverse determination on
11		behalf of the department and the beneficiary.
12	(b)	The state pharmacy assistance program is the payor of
13	last reso	rt[, subject to receipt of sufficient rebates pursuant
14	to sectio	n 346-342(g), as determined by the department].
15	(c)	The state pharmacy assistance program shall be funded
16	with stat	e appropriations [derived from revenues to the State
17	from reba	tes paid by pharmaceutical manufacturers pursuant to
18	section 3	46-342(g), which may affect the level of benefits to
19	program e	nrollees pursuant to subsection (a) depending on the
20	amount of	the rebates received by the State to cover all program
21	benefits	and costs of administering the program. and with

1	savings resulting from medicare prescription drug coverage for		
2	the medicaid dual eligible population."		
3	SECTION 4. Section 346-345, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
5	"(b) Moneys in the state pharmacy assistance program		
6	special fund may be used for:		
7	[(1) Reimbursement payments to participating pharmacies for		
8	co-payments required under the federal medicare part I		
9	pharmacy benefit program as provided to state pharmacy		
10	assistance program participants;		
11	(1) Payment of benefits under section 346-344;		
12	(2) The costs of administering the state pharmacy		
13	assistance program, including salary and benefits of		
14	employees, computer costs, and contracted services as		
15	provided in section 346-342(d); and		
16	(3) Any other purpose deemed necessary by the department		
17	for the purpose of operating and administering the		
18	state pharmacy [+]assistance[+] program.		
19	All interest on special fund balances shall accrue to the		
20	special fund. Upon dissolution of the state pharmacy assistance		
21	program special fund, any unencumbered moneys in the fund shall		
22	lapse to the general fund."

SECTION 5. Section 346-341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by deleting the definition of "full coverage 2 prescription drug benefit". 3 [""Full coverage prescription drug benefit" means a 4 federally approved prescription drug plan that offers a zero 5 co-payment benefit for medicaid dual eligibles under the 6 medicare part D drug benefit."] 7 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1 or so much thereof 9 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 for the state 10 pharmacy assistance program. 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 12 human services for the purposes of this Act. 13
