A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Although the State has established statewide
2	standards and benchmarks, learner outcomes, assessments,
3	promotion requirements, and graduation requirements, the
4	legislature finds that Hawaii's public school system does not
5	have a model curriculum to meet its goals. Because the present
6	curriculum is not standardized, individual teachers, grade
7	levels, schools, complexes, districts, vendors, and school
8	reform and reinvention teams make curriculum decisions.
9	In "The Link Between High School Reform and College Success
10	for Low-Income and Minority Youth", a publication of the
11	American Youth Policy Forum, the following curriculum-related
12	practices were included in the four key practices most commonly
13	cited for the success of low-income and minority high school
14	students in college:
15	(1) Access to a rigorous academic common core curriculum
16	for all students; and
17	(2) Alignment of the curriculum between various levels,

such as high school and post-secondary, and between

1	levels within the kindergarten through twelfth grade		
2	system.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to establish and maintain a		
4	model curriculum for teachers to meet the Hawaii performance		
5	standards as required by the federal No Child Left Behind Act of		
6	2001.		
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, part II, subpart B, Hawaii		
8	Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be		
9	appropriately designated and to read as follows:		
10	"§302A- Model curriculum. (a) The department shall		
11	establish a model curriculum, adapted from a research-based		
12	model that has proven to be successful, to be adopted by each		
13	school complex on a voluntary basis. The curriculum shall:		
14	(1) Be specific in its scope and sequence over a school		
15	<pre>year for each grade level;</pre>		
16	(2) Be consistent in course content;		
17	(3) Be aligned across all grade levels; and		
18	(4) Meet the state performance standards and reflect the		
19	requirements of the federal No Child Left Behind Act		
20	of 2001.		
21	(b) The model curriculum may be developed in separate		
22	parts to target specific needs or populations. The curriculum		

1	may adapt	national program curricula to meet Hawaii standards
2	and may i	nclude the subject areas of:
3	(1)	Information technology education;
4	(2)	Hawaiian education;
5	(3)	Career pathway education; and
6	(4)	Program curricula from America's choice, success for
7		all, core knowledge, direct instruction, or other
8		similar nationally-implemented programs.
9	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall establish and maintain the
10	curriculu	m and shall provide teachers with support resources,
11	which sha	11 include:
12	(1)	Professional development, which may be in the form of
13		school release days or professional development
14		credits;
15	(2)	Sample lesson plans and assessments for each standard
16		and benchmark outlined in the Hawaii performance
17		standards; and
18	(3)	Classroom-ready materials.
19	<u>(d)</u>	The department shall provide each teacher with
20	standards	-based model curriculum assessment tools to assess
21	students	multiple times during the school year.

1	(e) The model curriculum may be implemented during the
2	school year that begins after the board's final approval of the
3	model curriculum; provided that the curriculum shall be ready
4	for implementation no later than the 2008-2009 school year."
5	SECTION 3. The board of education shall submit annual
6	progress reports to the legislature no later than twenty days
7	prior to the convening of the 2007, 2008, and 2009 regular
8	sessions.
9	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
11	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 to
12	establish and maintain a model curriculum pursuant to this Act.
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
14	education for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
