1	No land shall be purchased for a sum greater than the
2	highest value fixed by the appraiser or appraisals; provided
3	that the board, after review of the appraisals by the appraiser
4	or appraisers, may purchase the land at a value greater than the
5	highest value if, after consultation with another independent
6	appraiser, the higher value is determined by the appraiser to be
7	justified and within the range of market value; provided further
8	that this limitation shall not apply where acquisition is by
9	condemnation. After the land has been acquired or the board
10	abandons the acquisition, the appraisal reports shall be
11	available for inspection and copying by the public.
12	(b) No appraisal shall be required under this section in
13	the event that an interest in land is donated to the State."

Description:

Clarifies the appraisal process for state acquisitions of "Lands Having Value as a Resource to the State"; permits the Board of Land and Natural Resources to purchase land at a cost higher than appraisal if it determines the higher cost is justified; and exempts donated lands from the appraisal requirements.
