# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER PROGRAM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 342G-102.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[+]\$342G-102.5[+] Reverse vending machine rebate program;
4	standards. (a) The department shall provide a rebate, not to
5	exceed \$3,000,000 [in the aggregate in any fiscal year,] of the
6	cost of purchasing [a] reverse vending [machine, machines,
7	including shipping and general excise tax, purchased by a
8	[ <del>dealer:</del> ] <u>person:</u>
9	(1) [That is a certified redemption center and that] That
10	agrees to maintain operations as a certified
11	redemption center for a minimum period of two years;
12	or
13	(2) That is serviced by a recycler that is a certified
14	redemption center; provided that the [dealer] person
15	has entered into a service agreement with the recycler
16	for a minimum period of two years.
17	(b) The rebate provided under this section shall be
18	granted for reverse vending machines that:

20	an] An ap	plication for rebate shall be made to the department on
21	forms pro	vided by the department to certify eligibility for a
22	rebate.	The application shall contain information determined by

- 1 the department to be required; provided that at a minimum, the
- 2 application shall require the applicant to provide the
- 3 following:
- 4 (1) The applicant's name;
- 5 (2) The location where each reverse vending machine will6 be installed and operated;
- 7 (3) A projection of the number of customers expected to use each reverse vending machine;
- 9 (4) The requested rebate amount;
- 10 (5) Proof of certification of the applicant's redemption
  11 center or, in the case of a [dealer] person that is
  12 serviced by a recycler, the executed service agreement
  13 between the recycler and [dealer;] person; and
- 14 (6) The projected installation date of each reverse15 vending machine.
- 16 (e) The [dealer or recycler] person or contracted recycler

  17 providing the certified redemption service shall comply with all

  18 rules of the department. If any [dealer or recycler] person or

  19 contracted recycler is found by the department to be not in

  20 compliance with the department's rules, the [dealer] person

  21 shall reimburse the department for the full amount of the

  22 rebate. The department may institute an action pursuant to

- 1 chapter 91 to recover any rebate paid under this section if the
- 2 [dealer,] person, or the recycler that has a contract with the
- 3 [dealer] person to service the reverse vending machine, fails to
- 4 comply with the requirements of this part or any rule adopted
- 5 pursuant to it.
- (f) Amounts received under this section shall not be
- 7 treated as income for purposes of chapter 235 or gross proceeds
- 8 or gross income for purposes of chapter 237.
- 9 (q) A reverse vending machine shall not be considered a
- 10 depreciable asset and no person may claim depreciation therefor,
- 11 at least to the extent that the reverse vending machine has been
- 12 purchased with rebate funds.
- (h) Any [dealer participating in the rebate program shall
- 14 not be eligible to participate in the person receiving funding
- 15 to cover the cost of purchase for reverse vending machines
- 16 through the redemption center and recycling infrastructure
- improvement program under section 342G-114.5[-] shall not be
- 18 eligible for this rebate.
- 19 (i) The director shall include in the deposit beverage
- 20 container program annual report to the legislature, a report on
- 21 the reverse vending machine rebate program."

1	SECTION 2. Act 228, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is		
2	amended by amending section 6 to read as follows:		
3	"SEC	TION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;	
4	provided that:		
5	(1)	This Act shall be repealed on [June 30, 2006,]	
6		June 30, 2008, and section 342G-104, Hawaii Revised	
7		Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which it	
8		read on the day before the effective date of this Act;	
9		and	
10	(2)	Any action initiated by the department of health	
11		pursuant to section 342G-A(e), Hawaii Revised	
12		Statutes, shall be allowed to continue until final	
13		resolution of the action is achieved."

Deposit Beverage Container Program

Extends reverse vending machine rebate program to persons who are not dealers or recyclers. Extends time for new rebate. Extends sunset date of Act 228, SLH 2005, to June 30, 2008. Effective date July 1, 2020. (SB3105 HD2)
