A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that according to 1 the national center for public policy and higher education, net 2 college costs for low- and middle-income students to attend 3 Hawaii's public four-year colleges and universities represent a 4 third of their families' annual income. In 2004, the national 5 non-profit independent organization gave Hawaii a "D" for 6 affordability. The organization also noted that "over the past 7 few years, Hawaii has had among the steepest declines in the 8 nation in the percentage of first-time, full-time college 9 students earning their bachelor's degree within six years of 10 enrolling in college." 11 During the 2005 legislative session, recognizing the need 12 to provide financial support to Hawaii's residents in attaining 13 a post secondary degree, the legislature appropriated \$1,500,000 14 in general funds for the fiscal biennium 2005-2007 to provide 15 merit-based scholarships for Hawaii's low-income public school 16 graduates wishing to attend the university. Despite this 17

appropriation, the legislature finds that the increases in the

tuition and fee schedule, which takes effect in the fall of 1 2006, will continue to make it difficult for Hawaii's residents 2 to attend the university. The legislature also finds that the 3 initial appropriation of \$1,500,000 is not sufficient to enroll 4 a significant proportion of the estimated number of eligible 5 applicants. 6 Given the State's current financial surplus, and based on 7 input from the university, the purpose of this Act is to 8 encourage Hawaii residents to pursue post secondary school 9 10 education by: (1) Amending section 57 of Act 178, Session Laws of Hawaii 11 2005, to increase the 2006-2007 appropriation to the 12 student scholarship and assistance special fund by 13 \$2,000,000; 14 Establishing a workforce development scholarship 15 (2) program at the community colleges based on need; and 16 Placing state funds for all scholarship programs in a 17 (3) separate account in the student scholarship and 18 assistance special fund. 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 305, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20

amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

and to read as follows:

1	"§305- Workforce development scholarship program. (a)
2	There is established the workforce development scholarship
3	program to be administered by the University of Hawaii to
4	address projected shortfalls in, and needs of the workforce.
5	The program shall be used to provide financial assistance for up
6	to three years to any qualified student enrolled at a community
7	college campus of the University of Hawaii.
8	(b) The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of
9	each scholarship shall be determined by the university and shall
10	be subject to the availability of funds. The University of
11	Hawaii shall offer scholarships to pay for educational costs,
12	such as tuition, fees, books, housing, and other educational
13	costs; provided that the scholarship applicant:
14	(1) Qualifies for Hawaii resident tuition;
15	(2) Earned a high school diploma or passed the general
16	educational development test; and
17	(3) Is eligible for need-based aid according to federal
18	financial aid guidelines.
19	The scholarship may be renewed annually for up to three years;
20	provided that the student maintains satisfactory academic
21	progress."

16	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
18	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 to
19	establish the workforce development scholarship program.
20	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
21	Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

Description:

Changes the income guidelines. Establishes a workforce development scholarship program at the community colleges. Specifies that state funds for all scholarship programs shall be placed in a separate account in the student scholarship and assistance special fund. Effective date 7/1/2020. (SB3120 HD1)
