## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CARE HOMES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 46-15.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 For the purpose of regulation under a county's life 4 safety code, building code, fire code, or any other ordinance of 5 similar purpose, a licensed adult family boarding home or 6 licensed care home [which] that provides living accommodations 7 for: 8 (1)The operator of the home and operator's family; and 9 (2)Up to [five] six other persons, not more than [two] 10 three of whom are incapable of self-preservation 11 because of age or physical or mental limitations [+], 12 shall be deemed a single-family dwelling occupied by a family." 13 SECTION 2. Section 321-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 15 The director shall adopt rules regarding adult 16 residential care homes in accordance with chapter 91 [which] 17 that shall be designed to:

1 (1)	Protect the health, safety, and civil rights of
2	persons residing in facilities regulated;
3 (2)	Provide for the licensing of adult residential care
4	homes; provided that the rules shall allow group
5	living in two categories of adult residential care
6	homes as licensed by the department of health:
7	(A) Type I allowing group living by $[five]$ six or
8	fewer unrelated persons; and
9	(B) Type II allowing [six] seven or more persons,
10	including but not limited to the mentally ill,
11	elders, the handicapped, the developmentally
12	disabled, or totally disabled persons who are not
13	related to the home operator or facility staff[ $\div$
14	For purposes of this section:
15	"Mentally ill person" means a mentally ill person
16	as defined under section 334-1.
17	"Elder" means an elder as defined under sections
18	<del>201G-1 and 201G-151.</del>
19	"Handicapped person" means an individual with a
20	physical handicap as defined under section 515-2.

6	(3) Comply with applicable federal laws and regulations of

10	For the purposes of this subsection:		
11	"Developmentally disabled" means a person with		
12	developmental disabilities as defined under section 333F-1.		
13	"Elder" has the same meaning as defined under section 201G-		
14	<u>1.</u>		
15	"Handicapped" means an individual with a disability as		
16	defined under section 515-2.		
17	"Mentally ill" means a mentally ill person as defined under		
18	section 334-1.		
19	"Totally disabled person" means a person totally disabled		
20	as defined under section 235-1."		
21	SECTION 3. Section 321-15.62, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
22	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		

1	"(b) The director <u>of health</u> shall adopt rules regarding
2	expanded adult residential care homes in accordance with chapter
3	91 [which] that shall implement a social model of health care
4	designed to:
5	(1) Protect [the] persons' health, safety, and civil
6	rights, [and] as well as rights of choice [of the
7	persons] to reside in a nursing facility or in home-
8	or community-based care;
9	(2) Provide for the licensing of expanded adult
10	residential care homes for persons who are certified
11	by the department of human services, a physician,
12	advanced practice registered nurse, or registered
13	nurse case manager as requiring skilled nursing
14	facility level or intermediate care facility level of
15	care who have no financial relationship with the home
16	care operator or facility staff; provided that the
17	rules shall allow group living in the following two
18	categories of expanded adult residential care homes as
19	licensed by the department of health:

(A) [Type] A type I home shall consist of [five] six
or [less] fewer residents with no more than [two]
three nursing facility level residents; provided

1	that at least one bed shall be reserved for
2	medicaid patients; provided further that more
3	nursing facility level residents may be allowed
4	at the discretion of the department; and
5	(B) $[\frac{Type}{A \text{ type}}]$ A type II home shall consist of $[\frac{six}{A}]$
6	seven or more residents, with no more than twenty
7	per cent of the home's licensed capacity [as] at
8	nursing facility level [residents; of care;
9	provided that at least one bed shall be reserved
10	for medicaid patients; provided further that more
11	nursing facility level residents may be allowed
12	at the discretion of the department; and
13	provided further that the department shall exercise
14	its discretion for a resident presently residing in a
15	[Type] type I or $[Type]$ type II home, to allow the
16	resident to remain as an additional nursing facility
17	level resident based upon the best interests of the
18	resident. The best interests of the resident shall be
19	determined by the department after consultation with
20	the resident, the resident's family, primary
21	physician, case manager, primary caregiver, and home
22	operator;

1	(3)	Comply with applicable federal laws and regulations of
2		Title XVI of the Social Security Act, as amended; and
3	(4)	Provide penalties for the failure to comply with any
4		rule."
5	SECT	ION 4. Section 346-331, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended b	y amending the definition of "community care foster
7	family ho	me" or "home" to read as follows:
8	""Coi	mmunity care foster family home" or "home" means a home
9	that, for	the purposes of this part:
10	(1)	Is regulated by the department in accordance with
11		rules that are equitable in relation to rules that
12		govern expanded adult residential care homes;
13	(2)	Is issued a certificate of approval by the department
14		or its designee to provide, for a fee, twenty-four-
15		hour living accommodations, including personal care
16		and homemaker services, for not more than [two] three
17		adults at any one time, at least [one] two of whom
18		shall be [a] medicaid [recipient, recipients, who are
19		at the nursing facility level of care, who are
20		unrelated to the foster family, and $\underline{\text{who}}$ are receiving
21		the services of a licensed home and community-based
22		case management agency; and

2 or assisted living facilities, both of which shall 3 continue to be licensed by the department of health." 4 SECTION 5. Section 346-332, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 "[+] \$346-332[+] Applicability. (a) Prior to June 30, 7 2006, this part shall apply to the demonstration project 8 statewide. 9 (b) Community care foster family homes shall be required 10 to reserve at least [one bed] two beds for medicaid patients. 11 (c) Expanded adult residential care homes shall be 12 required to reserve at least one bed for medicaid patients." 13 SECTION 6. Act 273, Session Laws of Hawaii 2001, as 14 amended by Act 95 and Act 98, Session Laws of Hawaii 2003, and 15 Act 153, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, is amended by amending 16 section 6 to read as follows: 17 "SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2001[7 18 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2006]." 19 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
