A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTAL SPECIALISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 448, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§448- Licensure without examination for dental
5	specialists licensed in another state. (a) The board may grant
6	a license to practice dentistry to a qualified applicant who is
7	a dental specialist and who has not fulfilled the requirements
8	of section 448-9.4. An applicant is a dental specialist if the
9	applicant has graduated from an accredited dental specialty
10	education program in orthodontics, endodontics, pedodontics,
11	periodontics, oral surgery, oral radiology, public health
12	dentistry, prosthodontics, or oral medicine or pathology. A
13	qualified applicant under this section includes a person who has
14	graduated from an accredited dental specialty education program
15	whether or not the applicant has applied and been denied
16	licensure under any other applicable laws of the State.
17	(b) The applicant under this section shall submit all of
18	the following to the board:



1	(1)	A completed application and all required fees;
2	(2)	Verification of graduation from a general dental
3		education program accredited by the American Dental
4		Association (ADA) Commission on Dental Accreditation
5		or the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada;
6	(3)	Verification of graduation from a post-graduate
7		specialty program accredited by the ADA Commission on
8		Dental Accreditation;
9	(4)	Verification of a current active license issued by
10		another state that is not revoked, suspended, or
11		otherwise restricted;
12	<u>(5)</u>	Verification that the applicant has been lawfully
13		engaged in the practice of dentistry for at least five
14		years within a seven-year period preceding the date of
15		the application, with a minimum of one thousand hours
16		of dentistry practice in the dental specialty each
17		year; provided that the applicant may receive credit
18		for two of the five years of clinical practice by
19		demonstrating completion of a specialty residency
20		training program accredited by the ADA Commission on
21		Dental Accreditation;

1	(6)	Verification of completion of a minimum of thirty-two
2		hours of continuing education in the applicant's
3		dental specialty within the preceding two-year period;
4	(7)	Verification that the applicant has not been subject
5		to disciplinary action by any jurisdiction in which
6		the applicant is or has been previously licensed to
7		practice dentistry; provided that if the applicant has
8		been subject to disciplinary action, the board shall
9		review that action to determine if it warrants refusal
10		to issue a license to the applicant;
11	(8)	Verification that the applicant has no felony
12		convictions of any kind and no other criminal
13		convictions that may affect the applicant's ability to
14		render competent dental care;
15	(9)	Verification of registration status with the federal
16		Drug Enforcement Administration and a self-query
17		report from the National Practitioner Data Bank;
18		provided that the board shall review this information
19		to determine if it warrants refusal to issue a license
20		to the applicant; and
21	(10)	Verification of passage of parts I and II of the
22		National Board Dental Examination.

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1	(c) For purposes of this section, an approved ADA
2	residency program qualifies as the practice of dentistry under
3	section 448-1.
4	(d) An applicant under this section shall agree to
5	practice only as a dental specialist within the area of the
6	applicant's specialization."
7	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
