
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSUMERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 486H-1 , Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by deleting the definitions of "commission",
3 "independent retail station", "non-refiner marketer", "pre-tax",
4 and "self-serve basis".

5 ["Commission" means the public utilities commission.]

6 "Independent retail station" means a retail service station
7 not owned by a manufacturer or jobber and operated by a
8 qualified gasoline dealer.

9 "Non-refiner marketer" means any person who acquires
10 gasoline for sale in the State of Hawaii, and who is not a
11 refiner located and operating in the State of Hawaii, nor an
12 importer owned by or affiliated with, directly or indirectly, by
13 a refiner located and operating in the State of Hawaii.

14 "Pre-tax" when used in reference to a price means such
15 price net of the fuel related or other taxes assessed when the
16 gasoline is sold.

17 "Self-serve basis" means that the retail station allows
18 customers to dispense gasoline into vehicles."]



1 SECTION 2. Section 486H-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 repealed.

3 ~~["§486H-13 Maximum pre-tax wholesale price for the sale of~~
4 ~~gasoline; civil actions.~~ (a) Notwithstanding any law to the
5 contrary, no manufacturer, wholesaler, or jobber may sell
6 regular unleaded, mid-grade, or premium gasoline to a dealer
7 retail station, an independent retail station, or to another
8 jobber or wholesaler at a price above the maximum pre-tax
9 wholesale prices established pursuant to subsection (b). The
10 commission shall publish the maximum pre-tax wholesale prices by
11 means that shall include the Internet website for the State of
12 Hawaii.

13 (b) On a weekly basis, the commission shall determine the
14 maximum pre-tax wholesale price of regular unleaded, mid-grade,
15 and premium gasoline as follows: the maximum pre-tax wholesale
16 price of regular unleaded gasoline shall consist of the baseline
17 price for regular unleaded gasoline, plus the location
18 adjustment factor, the marketing margin factor, and the zone
19 price adjustment, and for mid-grade and premium gasoline, the
20 applicable mid-grade and premium adjustment factor, such that
21 the maximum pre-tax wholesale gasoline prices reflect and
22 correlate with competitive market conditions.



1 (e) The baseline price for regular unleaded gasoline
2 referred to in subsection (b) shall be determined on a weekly
3 basis and shall be equal to the average of:
4 (1) The weekly average of the spot daily price for regular
5 unleaded gasoline for Los Angeles;
6 (2) The weekly average of the spot daily price for regular
7 unleaded gasoline for New York Harbor; and
8 (3) The weekly average of the spot daily price for regular
9 unleaded gasoline for the United States Gulf Coast;
10 as reported and published by the Oil Price Information Service
11 for the five business days of the preceding week; provided that
12 the commission, in its discretion, may determine a more
13 appropriate baseline or a more appropriate price information
14 reporting service.

15 (d) The location adjustment factor referred to in
16 subsection (b) shall be \$.04 per gallon or as otherwise
17 determined by the commission and shall thereafter be subject to
18 adjustment pursuant to section 486H-16(a).

19 (e) The marketing margin factor referred to in subsection
20 (b) shall be \$.18 per gallon or as otherwise determined by the
21 commission and shall thereafter be subject to adjustment
22 pursuant to section 486H-16(a).



1 (f) The mid grade adjustment factor shall be \$.05 per
2 gallon or as otherwise determined by the commission and shall
3 thereafter be subject to adjustment pursuant to section 486H
4 16(a).

5 (g) The premium adjustment factor shall be \$.09 per gallon
6 or as otherwise determined by the commission and shall
7 thereafter be subject to adjustment pursuant to section 486H
8 16(a).

9 (h) For purposes of this chapter, the State shall be
10 divided into the following zones:

- 11 (1) Zone 1 shall include the island of Oahu;
- 12 (2) Zone 2 shall include the island of Kauai;
- 13 (3) Zone 3 shall include the island of Maui, except the
14 district of Hana;
- 15 (4) Zone 4 shall include the district of Hana on the
16 island of Maui;
- 17 (5) Zone 5 shall include the island of Molokai;
- 18 (6) Zone 6 shall include the island of Lanai;
- 19 (7) Zone 7 shall include the districts of Puna, south
20 Hilo, north Hilo, and Hamakua on the island of Hawaii;
21 and



1 (8) Zone 8 shall include the districts of north Kohala,
2 south Kohala, north Kona, south Kona, and Kau on the
3 island of Hawaii.

4 (i) The commission shall establish zone price adjustments
5 to the maximum pre-tax wholesale regular unleaded, mid grade,
6 and premium gasoline prices on a zone by zone basis.

7 (j) Every manufacturer, wholesaler, or jobber, upon the
8 request of the commission, shall furnish to the commission, in
9 the form requested, all documents, data, and information the
10 commission may require to make its determination on zone price
11 adjustments. Any person who refuses or fails to comply with a
12 request for information by the commission shall be subject to a
13 fine of up to \$50,000 per day. Each day a violation continues
14 shall constitute a separate offense.

15 (k) The maximum pre-tax wholesale gasoline price imposed
16 by this section shall take effect on September 1, 2005,
17 notwithstanding the lack of the adoption of rules pursuant to
18 this section.

19 (l) Any manufacturer, wholesaler, or jobber who knowingly
20 violates any requirement imposed or rule adopted under this
21 section, except for subsection (j), shall be subject to a civil
22 penalty, for each violation, equal to three times the amount of



1 the overcharge or \$250,000, whichever is greater, and shall be
2 liable for the costs of the action and reasonable attorney's
3 fees as determined by the court. Within two years from the date
4 the commission obtains actual knowledge of the violation, the
5 commission may institute a civil action in a court of competent
6 jurisdiction to collect the civil penalty, the costs, and
7 attorney's fees. In the case of ongoing violation, the two-year
8 period shall start from the date of the last violation. The
9 commission may refer any such action to the attorney general as
10 it deems appropriate. As used in this subsection, "overcharge"
11 means the number of gallons of gasoline sold, times the
12 wholesale price at which the manufacturer or jobber sold regular
13 unleaded, mid-grade, or premium gasoline to a dealer retail
14 station, an independent retail station, or another jobber or
15 wholesaler, less taxes assessed, less the maximum pre-tax
16 wholesale price established pursuant to subsection (b).

17 (m) The commission shall have the power to determine the
18 extent to which a manufacturer, wholesaler, or jobber is
19 complying with any requirement imposed or rule adopted under
20 this section, including the power to compel a manufacturer,
21 wholesaler, or jobber to submit documents, data, and information
22 necessary and appropriate for the commission to determine such



1 compliance. The commission may use data collected by the
2 department of business, economic development, and tourism
3 pursuant to chapter 486J, as well as obtain the assistance of
4 that department in determining such compliance.

5 (n) The commission shall report to the governor and the
6 legislature, in a timely manner, on any significant aberrations,
7 trends, or conditions that may adversely impact the gasoline
8 consumers in the State.

9 (o) The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
10 91 as may be necessary to implement this section and section
11 486H-16.]

12 SECTION 3. Sections 486H-15, 486H-16, and 486H-17 Hawaii
13 Revised Statutes, are repealed.

14 ["**S486H-15 Governor's emergency powers.** (a)
15 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the governor may
16 suspend, in whole or in part, section 486H-13 or any rule
17 adopted pursuant to that section whenever the governor issues a
18 written determination that strict compliance with the section or
19 a rule will cause a major adverse impact on the economy, public
20 order, or the health, welfare, or safety of the people of
21 Hawaii. In the written determination, the governor shall state
22 the specific provision of the section or rule that strict



1 compliance with will cause a major adverse impact on the
2 economy, public order, or the health, welfare, or safety of the
3 people of the State, along with specific reasons for that
4 determination. The governor shall publish this determination in
5 accordance with section 1-28.5. The suspension shall take
6 effect upon issuance of the written determination by the
7 governor.

8 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), the suspension
9 under subsection (a) shall remain in effect until the earlier
10 of:

11 (1) The adjournment of the next regular or special session
12 of the legislature; or
13 (2) The effective date of any legislative enactment
14 intended to address the major adverse impact;
15 provided that if the legislature has passed legislation to
16 address the major adverse impact, and the governor vetoes the
17 presented legislation, the suspension shall terminate on the
18 date of that veto, and the maximum pre-tax wholesale gasoline
19 prices in effect immediately prior to the issuance of the
20 written determination by the governor shall take effect on the
21 day after the date of the veto; and provided further that if no
22 action is taken by the legislature during the regular or special



1 session to address the major adverse impact, then the maximum
2 pre-tax wholesale gasoline prices in effect immediately prior to
3 the issuance of the written determination by the governor shall
4 take effect on the day after adjournment sine die of the regular
5 or special session.

6 (c) If the written determination is issued while the
7 legislature is in session, the suspension under subsection (a)
8 shall remain in effect until the earlier of:

9 (1) The adjournment of that session of the legislature; or
10 (2) The effective date of any legislative enactment
11 intended to address the major adverse impact;
12 provided that if the legislature has passed legislation to
13 address the major adverse impact, and the governor vetoes the
14 presented legislation, the suspension shall terminate on the
15 date of that veto, and the maximum pre-tax wholesale gasoline
16 prices in effect immediately prior to the issuance of the
17 written determination by the governor shall take effect on the
18 day after the date of the veto; and provided further that if no
19 action is taken by the legislature during the regular or special
20 session to address the major adverse impact, then the maximum
21 pre-tax wholesale gasoline prices in effect immediately prior to
22 the issuance of the written determination by the governor shall



1 take effect on the day after adjournment sine die of the regular
2 or special session."

3 **S486H-16 Adjustments.** (a) A manufacturer, wholesaler, or
4 jobber may petition the commission to adjust the maximum pre-tax
5 wholesale price of regular unleaded, mid-grade, or premium
6 gasoline in the event of a change in the value of the baseline
7 price for regular unleaded gasoline, the location adjustment
8 factor, the marketing margin factor, the mid-grade adjustment
9 factor, the premium adjustment factor, or a zone price
10 adjustment. The petitioner shall bear the burden of proof to
11 establish by clear and convincing evidence the need for and the
12 amount of any adjustment. The adjustments shall be determined
13 as follows:

14 (1) The value of the baseline price shall be equal to the
15 average of:
16 (A) The weekly average of the spot daily price for
17 regular unleaded gasoline for Los Angeles;
18 (B) The weekly average of the spot daily price for
19 regular unleaded gasoline for New York Harbor;
20 and

10 ~~at the time the petition is filed shall be adjusted to~~

4 (3) The value of the marketing margin factor in effect at
5 the time the petition is filed shall be adjusted by
6 adding to such value the difference between:

7 (A) The average of the difference over the prior
8 twelve month period between:

9 (i) The dealer tank wagon price for sales for
10 resale for "regular" gasoline; and
11 (ii) The bulk price for sales for resale for
12 "regular" gasoline,

13 for Petroleum Administration for Defense (PAD)
14 District V, as reported and published by the
15 Energy Information Administration or its
16 successor in Table 31 - "Motor Gasoline Prices by
17 Grade, Sales Type, PAD District, and State" or
18 other source containing the same information;
19 less

20 (B) The average of the difference over the period
21 from 1994 until the most current year between:



- 1 (i) The dealer tank wagon price for sales for
2 resale for "regular" gasoline; and
3 (ii) The bulk price for sales for resale for
4 "regular" gasoline,
5 for Petroleum Administration for Defense (PAD)
6 District V, as reported and published by the
7 Energy Information Administration or its
8 successor in Table 31 - "Motor Gasoline Prices by
9 Grade, Sales Type, PAD District, and State" or
10 other source containing the same information;
- 11 (4) The value of the mid grade and premium adjustment
12 factors in effect at the time the petition is filed
13 shall be adjusted by any material change in the mid-
14 grade and premium adjustment factor as published by an
15 appropriate price information reporting service; and
16 (5) The value of any zone price adjustment in effect at
17 the time the petition is filed shall be adjusted based
18 upon material changes in the operating costs for a
19 zone, such as terminaling, storage, or distribution
20 costs, and other empirical data the commission deems
21 appropriate.



1 (b) If the commission adjusts the maximum pre-tax
2 wholesale gasoline prices, the commission shall publish its
3 findings and the adjusted prices by means that shall include the
4 Internet website for the State of Hawaii.

5 (e) Regardless of whether a petition has been filed and
6 notwithstanding a determination of the adjustments made pursuant
7 to subsection (a), the commission, in its discretion, may make
8 such other and further adjustments deemed necessary and
9 appropriate to establish maximum pre-tax wholesale gasoline
10 prices that reflect and correlate with competitive market
11 conditions.

12 [§486H-17] **Restricting supply of petroleum products.** The
13 attorney general shall immediately investigate any shortage or
14 condition affecting the supply of any petroleum products or
15 other matters relating to the requirements of this chapter and
16 shall institute all appropriate criminal and civil actions and
17 pursue all legal and equitable remedies that may be available to
18 the State. The attorney general shall submit a report to the
19 legislature regarding any shortage or condition affecting the
20 supply of petroleum products.]
