## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that immaturity and lack 1
- 2 of driving experience make younger drivers a hazard on the road.
- 3 Cell phones in the car give novice drivers one more distraction
- that they may not be able to manage as easily as more 4
- experienced drivers. The legislature further finds that under 5
- state law, instruction permits may be granted to drivers who are 6
- fifteen years and six months or older. The purpose of this Act 7
- is to prohibit drivers who have only a temporary instruction 8
- permit from using a wireless telephone while operating a motor 9
- 10 vehicle.
- SECTION 2. Section 286-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11
- amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows: 12
- "(e) No holder of a temporary instruction permit shall 13
- operate a motorcycle or a motor scooter during hours of darkness 14
- or carry any passengers. No holder of a temporary instruction 15
- permit shall operate a motor vehicle while using a wireless 16
- telephone." 17
- SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 18
