A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Hawaii is home to two of the world's premier
2	astronomy observatories, Haleakala on Maui and Mauna Kea on
3	Hawaii. Mauna Kea is considered the finest observing site in
4	the world. One of the most critical needs for preserving the
5	value of these sites is to reduce bright sources of light that
6	penetrate the dark night sky. Recent nighttime images from the
7	international space station revealed that some of the brightest
8	sources of light on Maui and Hawaii are the airports and harbors
9	on both islands. Astronomers on Mauna Kea are now detecting
10	artificial light sources from urban areas that are diminishing
11	the telescopes' ability to do research.
12	The purpose of the Act is to require the department of
13	transportation, to the extent that is practical:
14	(1) To comply with county ordinances and standards
15	relating to outside lighting at airports, harbors, and

SECTION 3. Part I of Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 1 is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately 2 designated and to read as follows: 3 Outdoor lighting. (a) To the extent that is 4 "§266practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or 5 federal law, regulation, or mandate, in the event that any 6 harbor regulation or standard relating to outdoor lighting at 7 any harbor facility conflicts with any county ordinance or other 8 regulation regarding the same areas, the more stringent 9 requirement or standard shall govern. 10 Outdoor lighting at all harbor facilities shall be 11 (b) equipped with fully shielded lens fixtures directing the 12 13 lighting downward. (c) Where harbor operations cease at night, the department 14 shall minimize outdoor lighting to the minimum level necessary 15 16 for safety and security." SECTION 4. Part III of Chapter 264, Hawaii Revised 17 Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately 18 19 designated and to read as follows: "§264- Highway lighting. (a) To the extent that is

practical and not in conflict with any safety regulations or

federal law, regulation, or mandate, in the event of any highway
