## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. After extensive deliberations, the interagency
2	working group, which was established pursuant to part VIII of
3	Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, the "Reinventing Education
4	Act of 2004," has recommended to the legislature that the
5	transfer of functions from the department of budget and finance
6	the department of the attorney general, and the department of
7	human services to the department of education specified in Act
8	51 be repealed. The working group also recommended that the
9	transfer of functions from the department of health to the
10	department of education specified in Act 51 be delayed one year
11	and take effect July 1, 2007, rather than July 1, 2006.
12	The interagency working group recommended to the 2006
13	legislature that fiscal functions should remain with the
14	department of budget and finance. The working group reported
15	that the departments of education and budget and finance have
16	agreed to improve the:
17	(1) Processes related to capital improvement project
18	allotments;

1	(2) Fiscal processes affecting the calculation of employee
2	benefits; and
3	(3) Expenditures of federal funds.
4	The departments will work together to prepare memorandums or
5	memorandums of understanding to set forth the new processes,
6	mutually agreed upon, between the two departments.
7	The interagency working group also recommended against
8	transferring the functions relating to workers' compensation and
9	labor-management relations from the department of the attorney
	general to the department of education at this time. Instead,
10	the departments will prepare memorandums of agreement or service
11	level agreements that clarify the scope of relevant
12	responsibilities, procedures, and protocols for the respective
13	responsibilities, procedures, and r
14	departments.
15	The working group noted that the department of education is
16	required by statute to conduct criminal history record checks on
17	employees that work in close proximity to children. Therefore,
18	it is not necessary that the department of human services
19	perform this service for the department of education.
2	The interagency working group further recommended that the
2	transfer of the school health aides and the public health nurses
	who supervise the school health aides be delayed one year from

July 1, 2006, to July 1, 2007. The department of education 1 requested the delay due to the number of other requirements of 2 Act 51 that are scheduled to be implemented during the 2006-2007 3 school year. In addition, both the department of education and 4 the department of health desire to have a smooth transition and 5 additional time will make this possible. 6 Although the working group recommended the repeal of certain 7 specific provisions of Act 51 relating to the transfer of 8 functions in the departments of budget and finance and attorney 9 general's office, they noted that the provisions the working 10 group recommended to be repealed did serve a useful purpose in 11 helping to focus the departments on areas of concern. 12 recommendations to repeal certain statutory provisions were 13 mutual decisions the departments reached after extensive 14 discussion and review. The function of Act 51 as a critical 15 catalyst for analysis and discussion of issues and problems has 16 been, and continues to be, fulfilled. 17 The departments involved will not continue to do "business 18 as usual". The legislature fully expects the departments to 19 remain committed to continuous improvement and that the 20 memorandums, memorandums of agreements, and service level

agreements, when completed and implemented in accordance with the

1 departments' agreements, are a critical step toward improving the 2 educational system for our community. Therefore, based on the interagency working group's 3 recommendations contained in their report to the 2006 regular 4 session of the legislature, the purpose of this Act is to amend 5 Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004. 6 SECTION 2. Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, is amended 7 by amending section 47 to read as follows: 8 "SECTION 47. #### Report Title:

Department of Education; Employment; Personnel Transfers

### Description:

Repeals the transfer of functions from the departments of budget and finance, attorney general, and human services to the department of education. Delays the transfer of school health aides and public health nurses from the department of health to the department of education.
