# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that educational systems
2	today are faced with changing needs and growing demands, but
3	tighter budgets. To meet the challenge of 21st century
4	realities, educational systems, and the leadership and
5	management structures within them, must be rethought.
6	With its multi-million dollar annual budget, large consumer
7	base, and wide-reaching impact, the State of Hawaii department
8	of education is much like a large corporation. In these modern
9	times, most successful corporations are operated through the
10	leadership and management of individuals who lend their
11	expertise to steer businesses in the best possible direction.
12	Corporations employ chief financial officers, for example, to
13	effectively manage their budgets and finances. These officers
14	play a critical role in determining business goals and the
15	ability to meet them by maximizing resources and ensuring
16	efficient operations from a financial perspective.
17	It is only reasonable that an institution as important as

the department of education--one that cradles the future of our

- 1 children and State--be operated as would a successful
- 2 corporation, under the guidance of a chief financial officer to
- 3 work hand-in-hand with the superintendent.
- 4 There are many experts in our local business community who
- 5 agree that improving the administration of the department of
- 6 education is in order. The department needs a comprehensive
- 7 budgeting and accounting system that takes into account the
- 8 whole picture, from the administration to the school level. As
- 9 any responsible business employs measures to ensure
- 10 accountability and transparency of financial operations, a chief
- 11 financial officer would be the authority on how educational
- 12 dollars are being spent--resources entrusted to them by Hawaii's
- 13 taxpayers. A chief financial officer would greatly strengthen
- 14 the operations of the department of education.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to strengthen the operations of
- 16 the department of education by creating a chief financial
- 17 officer position and a secretary position in the office of the
- 18 superintendent.
- 19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$110,000, or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for the
- 22 establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) permanent

- 1 assistant superintendent position in the department of education
- 2 office of the superintendent to perform the functions of a chief
- 3 financial officer, including the preparation, management, and
- 4 execution of the department of education's financial statements,
- 5 budgets, accounting, and vendor payments.
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$43,000, or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for the
- 9 establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) permanent
- 10 secretary position in the department of education to assist the
- 11 assistant superintendent performing the functions of a chief
- 12 financial officer.
- 13 SECTION 4. The sums appropriated in this part shall be
- 14 expended by the department of education for the purposes of this
- 15 Act.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
