A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) With respect to the executive branch, except the
4	University of Hawaii[$_{ au}$] until June 30, 2010, the Hawaii tourism
5	authority, and the department of education, the comptroller
6	shall have complete supervision of all accounts. The
7	comptroller shall preaudit all proposed payments of \$10,000 or
8	more to determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance
9	with executive orders and rules that may be in effect. When
10	necessary, the comptroller shall withhold approval of any
11	payment. Whenever approval is withheld, the department or
12	agency concerned shall be promptly notified. With respect to
13	the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority, and the
14	department of education, the comptroller shall issue warrants
15	for the release of funds for the operating costs of the
16	university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or the department of
17	education, as applicable, in amounts and at times mutually
18	agreed upon by the governor or director of finance and the

university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of 1 education, as applicable; provided: 2 3 The amounts released shall not exceed the allotment (1)4 ceilings for the respective funding sources of the 5 university's or the department of education's appropriations established by the governor for an 6 7 allotment period pursuant to section 37-34, or in the case of the Hawaii tourism authority, revenues 8 received by the convention center enterprise special 9 fund and the tourism special fund pursuant to section 10 11 237D-6.5; and The comptroller may issue warrants as an advance from 12 (2) the state treasury to the University of Hawaii, the 13 Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of 14 education to establish a checking account and provide 15 working capital in amounts and at times mutually 16 agreed upon by the governor or director of finance and 17 the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism 18 authority, and the department of education. 19 20 The University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of education shall preaudit all proposed payments to 21

The University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of education shall make disbursements for 3 4 operating expenses from the amounts released by the comptroller 5 and maintain records and documents necessary to support those 6 disbursements at times mutually agreed upon by the university 7 president, the executive director of the Hawaii tourism authority, or the superintendent of education, as applicable, 8 and the comptroller; provided that when requested by the 9 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of 10 11 education, the comptroller shall make all disbursements for the university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of 12 education, as applicable, subject to available allotment. Funds 13 released pursuant to this section shall be deposited by the 14 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of 15 16 education, as applicable, in accordance with the provisions applicable to the director of finance by chapter 38. Except for 17 moneys deposited by the Hawaii tourism authority in the 18 19 convention center enterprise special fund pursuant to section 20 201B-8, and in the tourism special fund pursuant to section 201B-11, any interest earned on the deposit of funds released 21

 treasury at the end of each fiscal year."
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 40-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "S40-2 Accounting systems and internal control; enforcing
- 6 the use of and inspection of the same. The accounting system
- 7 installed by the commission on public accountancy under Act 181,
- 8 Session Laws of Hawaii 1923, as amended by Act 220, Session Laws
- 9 of Hawaii 1925, for use in the offices of the comptroller,
- 10 director of finance, departmental and agency services of the
- 11 State, and the auditors, treasurers, departmental and agency
- 12 services of the several counties shall be the accounting and
- 13 reporting systems of the State and counties; provided that the
- 14 University of Hawaii, until June 30, 2010, may install a
- 15 different accounting system which shall be in conformity with
- 16 generally accepted accounting principles as applied to colleges
- 17 and universities; and provided further that the department of
- 18 education may install a different accounting system which shall
- 19 be in conformity to generally accepted accounting principles.
- 20 The comptroller shall make such changes and modifications in the
- 21 accounting system as shall from time to time appear to be in the
- 22 best interest of the State and counties.

1 The departments and agencies of the executive branch are respectively charged with the responsibility to maintain an 2 3 adequate system of internal control and with the further 4 responsibility to see that the internal control system continues 5 to function effectively as designed. The comptroller shall make such investigations and audits from time to time to enforce the 6 7 use of the accounting system and internal control systems in the 8 executive branch. 9 The judiciary, the legislature, and each county shall be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of its 10 11 respective internal control system." 12 SECTION 3. Section 40-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 "\$40-4 Publication of statements. The comptroller shall prepare and submit to the governor, immediately following the 15 16 close of each fiscal year, a statement of income and expenditure by funds, showing the principal sources of revenue, the function 17 18 or purpose for which expenditures were made, together with a 19 consolidated statement showing similar information for all 20 funds; also a statement showing the balance in each fund at the beginning of the fiscal year, plus the receipts, minus the 21

disbursements, and the balance on hand at the close of the

- 1 fiscal year after deducting outstanding warrants and vouchers.
- 2 The comptroller may request all agencies, the judiciary, the
- 3 University of Hawaii $[\tau]$ until June 30, 2010, the Hawaii tourism
- 4 authority, the department of education, and the legislature to
- 5 provide such information as may be required for the preparation
- 6 of statements."
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 40-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "\$40-6 Approval of business and accounting forms. The
- 10 comptroller shall determine the forms required to adequately
- 11 supply accounting and statistical data for the state government.
- 12 The comptroller shall require heads of departments and
- 13 establishments of the state government to submit proposed new
- 14 forms or proposed changes in current business and accounting
- ·15 forms for review and approval before ordering the same printed;
- 16 except that the University of Hawaii $[\tau]$ until June 30, 2010,
- 17 the Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of education
- 18 shall be subject to this requirement only with respect to
- 19 uniform business and accounting forms of statewide use in the
- 20 State's accounting system. All standard state forms shall be
- 21 classified, numbered, and standardized in design, dimensions,

color, and grade of paper and recorded in a catalogue of 1 accounting and statistical forms by the comptroller." 2 SECTION 5. Section 40-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended to read as follows: "§40-58 In favor of assignees. No assignment of moneys by 5 a person to whom the State is directly indebted shall be 6 7 effective unless the assignment is first approved by the comptroller or, in the case of the University of Hawaii until 8 June 30, 2010 and the department of education, by their 9 respective chief financial officers. The comptroller or the 10 11 chief financial officers of the University of Hawaii and the department of education may prescribe the form for an 12 assignment, and may approve the assignment within a reasonable 13 time period if, in their respective discretion, the rights or 14 obligations of the State, the University of Hawaii, or the 15 department of education under any contract or other undertaking 16 or under any law, rule, or order by a competent authority will 17 not be prejudiced thereby. Upon approval of the assignment, the 18 comptroller or the respective chief financial officers of the 19 University of Hawaii and the department of education shall draw 20 a warrant payable to the assignee. Except as to contracts 21

encumbered by the comptroller, the University of Hawaii, or the

1 department of education, each expending agency, upon notification of the comptroller's approval of an assignment, 2 3 shall prepare a claim for payment in accordance with the terms 4 of the assignment." 5 SECTION 6. Section 40-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 "§40-81 Report by agencies receiving special moneys. All 8 state officers, departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, or 9 agencies collecting or receiving any moneys not required by law to be deposited in the state treasury shall report to the 10 comptroller all receipts and disbursements on account thereof 11 12 for each quarterly period of the calendar year not later than the fifteenth day following the end of each quarterly period on 13 such forms and under such rules as may be prescribed by the 14 comptroller; provided that with respect to all moneys held 15 16 outside the state treasury by the University of Hawaii until June 30, 2010 or the department of education pursuant to the 17 18 authority granted to the university and the department of education by this chapter, the University of Hawaii and the 19 **20** department of education shall report to the comptroller all transactions for each quarterly period not later than the 21

fifteenth day following the end of each quarterly period on such

- 1 forms and under such rules as may be prescribed by the
- 2 comptroller."
- 3 SECTION 7. Section 12 of Act 321, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 4 1986; as amended by section 69 of Act 283, Session Laws of
- 5 Hawaii 1987; as amended by section 7 of Act 371, Session Laws of
- 6 Hawaii 1989; as amended by section 3 of Act 163, Session Laws of
- 7 Hawaii 1991; as amended by section 2 of Act 314, Session Laws of
- 8 Hawaii 1993; as amended by section 22 of Act 8, Special Session
- 9 Laws of Hawaii 1993, as amended by section 1 of Act 180, Session
- 10 Laws of Hawaii 1997; as amended by section 24 of Act 115,
- 11 Session Laws of Hawaii 1998; and as amended by section 1 of Act
- 12 137, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is amended to read as follows:
- "SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 1986[τ
- 14 and be repealed as of June 30, 2006; provided that on repeal
- 15 sections 40-1, 40-2, 40-4, 40-6 and 40-81, Hawaii Revised
- 16 Statutes, are reenacted in the form in which they read on June
- 17 30, 1986, and section 40-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 reenacted in the form in which it read on June 30, 1991]."
- 19 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 21 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2006.
