A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VACANCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 17-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"\$17-1 United States senator. When a vacancy occurs in
4	the office of United States senator the vacancy shall be filled
5	for the unexpired term at the following state general election[$ au$
6	provided that] if the vacancy occurs not later than 4:30 p.m. on
7	the sixtieth day prior to the primary for nominating candidates
8	to be voted for at the election[; otherwise]. Otherwise the
9	vacancy shall be filled at the state general election next
10	following. The chief election officer shall issue a
11	proclamation designating the election for filling the vacancy.
12	Pending the election, the governor shall make a temporary
13	appointment to fill the vacancy, and the person so appointed
14	shall be a registered member of the same political party as the
15	senator causing the vacancy and shall serve until the election
16	and qualification of the person duly elected to fill the vacancy
17	[and shall be a registered member of the same political party as
18	the senator causing the vacancy]. The governor shall select the

         SECTION 2. Section 17-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 18 [an] a temporary appointment within sixty calendar days
- 19 following the first day of vacancy to fill the vacancy for the
- 20 unexpired term and the appointee shall be of the same political
- 21 party or nonpartisanship as the person the appointee succeeds.
- 22 The governor shall select the person to fill the temporary

- 1 appointment from a list of names of nominees submitted to the
- 2 governor by the chair of the appropriate political party.
- 3 (b) In the case of a vacancy, the term of which does not
- 4 end at the next succeeding general election:
- 5 (1) If it occurs not later than on the tenth day prior to
- 6 the close of filing for the next succeeding primary
- 7 election, the vacancy shall be filled for the
- 8 unexpired term at the next succeeding general
- **9** election. The chief election officer shall issue a
- 10 proclamation designating the election for filling the
- vacancy. All candidates for the unexpired term shall
- be nominated and elected in accordance with this
- 13 title. Pending the election the governor shall make a
- 14 temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
- person so appointed shall serve until the election of
- 16 the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The
- appointee shall be of the same political party or
- nonpartisanship as the person the appointee
- 19 succeeds [-] and the temporary appointment shall be as
- provided in this section.
- 21 (2) If it occurs later than on the tenth day prior to the
- 22 close of filing for the next succeeding primary

1		election but not later than on the sixtieth day prior

4		nonpartisan candidates qualified for the primary
5		election ballot, nominations for the unexpired term
6		may be filed not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fiftieth
7		day prior to the next succeeding primary election.
8		The chief election officer shall issue a proclamation
9		designating the election for filling the vacancy.
10		Pending the election the governor shall make a
11		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
12		person so appointed shall serve until the election of
13		the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The
14		appointee shall be of the same political party or
15		nonpartisanship as the person the appointee
16		succeeds[-] and the temporary appointment shall be as
17		provided in this section.
18	(3)	If it occurs after the sixtieth day prior to the next
19		succeeding primary but not later than on the fiftieth
20		day prior to the next succeeding general election, or

if there are no qualified candidates for any party or `

nonpartisan candidates in the primary, the vacancy

1	shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next
2	succeeding general election. The chief election
3	officer shall issue a proclamation designating the
4	election for filling the vacancy. Party candidates
5	for the unexpired senate term shall be nominated by
6	the county committees of the parties not later than
7	4:30 p.m. on the fortieth day prior to the general
8	election; nonpartisan candidates may file nomination
9	papers for the unexpired term not later than 4:30 p.m.
10	on the fortieth day prior to the general election with
11	the nonpartisan candidate who is to be nominated to be
12	decided by lot, under the supervision of the chief
13	election officer. The candidates for the unexpired
14	term shall be elected in accordance with this title.
15	Pending the election the governor shall make a
16	temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
17	person so appointed shall serve until the election of
18	the person duly elected to fill such vacancy. The
19	appointee shall be of the same political party or
20	nonpartisanship as the person the appointee
21	succeeds[-] and the temporary appointment shall be as
22	provided in this section.

1 (4)If it occurs after the fiftieth day prior to the next 2 succeeding general election or if no candidates are 3 nominated, the governor shall make [an] a temporary appointment to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term 5 and the appointee shall be of the same political party 6 or nonpartisanship as the person the appointee 7 succeeds [-] and the temporary appointment shall be as provided in this section." 8 9 SECTION 4. Section 17-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "\$17-4 State representatives. (a) Whenever any vacancy 12 in the membership of the state house of representatives occurs, 13 the governor shall make [an] a temporary appointment within 14 sixty calendar days following the first day of vacancy to fill 15 the vacancy for the unexpired term and the appointee shall be of 16 the same political party or nonpartisanship as the person the 17 appointee succeeds. 18 If the person the appointee succeeds was a member of a 19 political party, the governor shall select the person to fill 20 the temporary appointment from a list of names of nominees 21 submitted to the governor by the chair of the appropriate 22 political party."
