## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMISSION ON SALARIES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by            |

| adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read |
| as follows:   |
| "§ - Commission on salaries. (a) Pursuant to article            |
| XVI of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, there is        |
| established a commission on salaries within the department of   |
| human resources development, for administrative purposes only.  |
| The commission shall consist of seven members of which:         |
| (1) Two members shall be appointed by the governor;             |
| (2) Two members shall be appointed by the president of the      |
| senate;   |
| (3) Two members shall be appointed by the speaker of the        |
| house of representatives; and                                   |
| (4) One member shall be appointed by the chief justice of       |
| the supreme court.  |
| Vacancies in these positions shall be filled in the same        |
| manner. The members of the commission shall serve without       |

The commission shall not review the salary of any position 3 4 in the department of education or the University of Hawaii. 5 The commission may recommend different salaries for 6 department heads and executive officers and different salary 7 ranges for deputies or assistants to department heads; provided 8 that the commission shall recommend the same salary range for 9 deputies or assistants to department heads within the same 10 department; provided further that the appointing official shall 11 specify the salary for a particular position within the 12 applicable range. 13 The commission shall not recommend salaries lower than salary amounts recommended by prior commissions replaced by this 14 15 Act. 16 (c) The commission may seek assistance from the department 17 of human resources development and any other agency in conducting its review, and all agencies shall fully cooperate 18 19 with the commission and provide any necessary information to the 20 commission upon request.

The commission shall convene in the month of November

1 fortieth legislative day of the regular session of 2008, and 2 every six years thereafter, the commission shall submit a report 3 of its findings and its salary recommendations to the 4 legislature, through the governor. The commission may include 5 incremental increases that take effect prior to the convening of 6 the next salary commission. 7 The recommended salaries submitted by the commission shall 8 become effective July 1 of the next fiscal year unless the legislature disapproves the recommended salaries submitted by 9 10 the commission through the adoption of a concurrent resolution, 11 which shall be approved by a simple majority of each house of 12 the legislature, prior to adjournment sine die of the 13 legislative session in which the recommended salaries are 14 submitted. 15 The governor shall include the salary amounts recommended by the commission and approved by the legislature in the 16 executive budget. If the salary amounts recommended by the 17 commission are disapproved by the legislature, the commission 18 19 shall reconvene in the November next following the legislative 20 disapproval to review the legislature's reasons for disapproving 21 its salary recommendation. The commission may submit a report

- 6 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000, or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for the
- 9 purposes of this Act. This amount shall be expended by the
- 10 department of human resources development.
- 11 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006, and
- 14 upon ratification of a constitutional amendment establishing a
- 15 salary commission to review and recommend salaries for the
- 16 governor, lieutenant governor, legislators, justices and judges,
- 17 the administrative director of the State, and department heads
- 18 or executive officers and their deputies or assistants.
