A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. A sustainable economy is one that integrates long-term economic growth, environmental quality, and social 2 3 fairness. Sustainable economic development is important to establishing a firm economic foundation in Hawaii, especially in 4 5 the small business sector. The Hawaii small business development center network 6 7 creates a sustainable economy by providing consulting and training to existing small businesses and new ventures. The 8 9 Hawaii small business development center network provides 10 consulting and training to more than two thousand businesses 11 annually, helping them to succeed and expand. The Hawaii small 12 business development center network is the only statewide business assistance organization in Hawaii. It is a matching-13 14 funds, partnership program that is administered by the University of Hawaii and partially funded by the United States 15 Small Business Administration, the University of Hawaii at Hilo, 16

and a consortium of other federal, state, and private-sector

sponsors and partners.

1 Management-force training promotes improvements in the 2 conditions under which small businesses thrive. The Hawaii 3 small business development center network has the experience to deliver such training, having provided management-force training 4 5 statewide since 1990. This investment in human capital will produce residual 6 benefits that will lead to real, sustained growth and high 7 8 productivity. Funding would generate approximately \$29,000,000 9 in annual economic impact. This projection is based on an 10 independent economic impact study completed in 2004, The Annual 11 Economic Impact of the Hawaii Small Business Development Center. 12 According to the study, for every dollar invested by the State, 13 \$4.45 is returned to the State in the first year in new, 14 incremental taxes through new job creation, safeguarding of 15 existing jobs, and sales increases. 16 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate moneys to the **17** Hawaii small business development center network to further its 18 work of providing assistance to small businesses through 19 management-force training. 20 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general

revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$680,000, or so much

thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, to expand

management-force development through consulting and training
services at the small business development center as follows:
(1) \$285,000 for consulting and training programs in
Kailua-Kona and Honolulu in compliance with the
requirements of the United States Small Business
Administration;
(2) \$75,000 to fill a vacant position at the Hawaii
business research Library;
(3) \$225,000 for program support; and
(4) \$95,000 to fund an existing, but vacant position for
an associate state director.
The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
