# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DECONTAMINATION OF ILLEGAL DRUG MANUFACTURING SITES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the contamination of 1 2 properties used to illegally manufacture methamphetamines poses a threat to public health and welfare. The legislature also 3 finds that there is no established protocol for the protection 4 5 of first responders and for the subsequent decontamination and 6 cleanup of these illegal manufacturing sites. The purpose of this Act to direct the department of health 7 to establish interim procedures and guidelines for emergency and 8 long-term decontamination and cleanup of illegal methamphetamine 9 10 manufacturing sites. SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the requirements of chapter 91, 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes, within ninety days of the effective 12 date of this Act, the department of health shall adopt interim 13 rules for procedures and quidelines for emergency and long-term 14 decontamination and cleanup of illegal methamphetamine 15 manufacturing sites. These procedures and guidelines shall 16

apply to properties that have been used to manufacture or store

methamphetamine and its precursor hazardous materials, until the

- 1 department of health develops permanent rules for a
- 2 comprehensive program for emergency and long-term
- 3 decontamination and cleanup of illegal methamphetamine
- 4 manufacturing sites. The department shall oversee and implement
- 5 the procedures and guidelines using current state statutes and
- 6 rules to the extent feasible.
- 7 The interim and permanent rules for procedures and
- 8 guidelines shall include but not be limited to the following
- 9 areas:
- 10 (1) Emergency response and inspection;
- 11 (2) Decontamination;
- 12 (3) Environmental cleanup; and
- 13 (4) Disposal of hazardous materials and wastes associated
- 14 with the unauthorized manufacturing or storage of
- methamphetamine.
- 16 The interim rules shall remain effective until the department
- 17 adopts permanent rules, pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised
- 18 Statutes, to replace them, which shall be on or before
- 19 December 31, 2007.
- 20 SECTION 3. (a) The department shall also identify and
- 21 evaluate the requirements necessary to establish a statewide
- 22 program for decontamination and cleanup of illegal

- 1 methamphetamine sites to ensure that program procedures provide
- 2 for decontamination, remediation, and safe reoccupancy and reuse
- 3 that is prompt and efficient.
- 4 (b) The evaluation shall include:
- 5 (1) An assessment of soil and groundwater impacts as a
- 6 result of the illegal manufacturing of methamphetamine
- 7 at selected residential and other buildings in Hawaii;
- **8** (2) A review of cleanup procedures at actual locations
- 9 where methamphetamine was illegally manufactured in
- 10 Hawaii;
- 11 (3) Recommended protocols for the first responder
- community that include the methods to be used in
- assessing the potential dangers of chemical
- 14 contamination and protecting first responders;
- 15 (4) A review of relevant department of health and Hawaii
- law enforcement records; and
- 17 (5) A review of standards and protocols used by other
- states and federal agencies or recommended by other
- organizations.
- The department shall submit a report of its interim
- 21 procedures and guidelines and evaluation to the legislature no
- 22 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular

- 1 session of 2007, and its permanent rules and evaluation no later
- 2 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session

- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006;
- 5 provided that section 2 of this Act shall be repealed on
- 6 January 1, 2008.

### Report Title:

Hazardous Chemicals; Illegal Drug Laboratories
