### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SENATOR OREN E. LONG SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Senator Hiram L.
- 2 Fong's legislative accomplishments in the United States Senate,
- 3 which enabled Hawaii to become a full and sovereign federal
- 4 state with the other forty-nine, owed greatly to the
- 5 collaboration and cooperation of his colleagues, particularly
- 6 the other Senator from Hawaii, Oren E. Long, and Senator Lyndon
- 7 B. Johnson, then Senate Majority Leader. Senator Long, with
- 8 Senator Fong and forty-eight other sponsors, introduced Senate
- 9 Bill 3395, which established the East-West Center. Senator Long
- 10 gave forty-one years of public service to Hawaii, as a public
- 11 school teacher and principal, rising to Superintendent of Public
- 12 Instruction (1934-46), Secretary of the Territory of Hawaii
- (1946-51), and then Governor of Hawaii (1951-53). Elected to
- 14 the United States Senate in 1959, he served until 1963 and died
- 15 in 1965, without any children, family, or clan in Hawaii. The
- 16 legislature intends to honor, recognize, and perpetuate the
- 17 memory of Senator Oren E. Long's lifelong contributions to the
- 18 people of Hawaii by establishing and endowing a scholarship in

his name and in his chosen profession of education at the 1 2 University of Hawaii. SECTION 2. Chapter 304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 5 and to read as follows: 6 The Senator Oren E. Long scholarship program; special fund. (a) There is created the Senator Oren E. Long 7 8 scholarship program to be administered by the University of 9 Hawaii. The program shall be used to provide financial support 10 to students enrolled at the college of education at the 11 University of Hawaii. 12 (b) Awards shall be granted annually to one female student and one male student who: 13 14 (1) Are graduates of a public high school in the State; (2) Are upperclassmen in the college of education at the 15 16 University of Hawaii; and Submit an essay on the senator's contributions to 17 (3) 18 Hawaii. (c) The amount to be awarded to a student shall be 19 20 determined by the board of regents with due regard to the total 21 amount of funds available for the program. The award that a student receives under this program may be used to cover the 22

- 1 costs of tuition and fees, the costs of textbooks and other
- 2 instructional materials, or the costs of room and board at a
- 3 dormitory or apartment maintained by the University of Hawaii or
- 4 to defray the difference between the student need as determined
- 5 by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and the total
- 6 cost of attendance.
- 7 (d) The board of regents shall adopt rules to implement
- 8 the Senator Oren E. Long scholarship program. The rules shall
- 9 be adopted pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the
- 10 public notice and public hearing requirements.
- 11 (e) There is hereby created the Senator Oren E. Long
- 12 scholarship program special fund. The special fund shall be
- 13 administered by the board of regents of the University of Hawaii
- 14 for the purposes of supporting the Senator Oren E. Long
- 15 scholarship program."
- 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000, or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
- 19 transfer into the Senator Oren E. Long scholarship program
- 20 special fund.
- 21 SECTION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 22 University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
