# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAID.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. On March 13, 2006, the department of human
2	services issued a request for proposals regarding the QUEST
3	program. A provision in the request for proposals required all
4	one hundred sixty-five thousand current QUEST beneficiaries to
5	re-select a QUEST plan and a primary care provider. The
6	department of human services referred to this process as
7	"positive enrollment."
8	All current QUEST beneficiaries have already selected and
9	been assigned to a QUEST health plan and have selected a primary
10	care physician. Requiring this vulnerable population to comply
11	with the positive enrollment requirements may cause confusion,
12	delay in needed health care procedures, disrupt case management,
13	or result in the loss of contact between patients and their
14	current primary care providers. Further, positive enrollment
15	may result in an indeterminate spectrum of adverse outcomes,
16	including additional costs and administrative burdens on QUEST
17	providers as well as on the department of human services.

1	This Act, which allows the department of human services to
2	provide for positive enrollment for an initial enrollment period
3	of sixty days will create a situation whereby all QUEST health
4	plans who bid on the request for proposals, including any new
5	plans that enter the marketplace, will be on an equal footing in
6	terms of being able to market to all QUEST enrollees to
7	stimulate and achieve competition as advocated by the department
8	of human services. However, to minimize any possible disruption
9	of service, this Act provides some limitations to the positive
10	enrollment program. The major limitation is that, of the number
11	of QUEST beneficiaries that do not enroll in a health plan
12	during the initial enrollment period and will be auto-assigned
13	to a plan, the department of human services will auto-assign not
14	more than five per cent of the total QUEST beneficiaries. The
15	five per cent amount was chosen because the department of human
16	services has maintained that only five per cent of the total
17	QUEST membership do not choose a plan. For example, if there
18	are one hundred sixty-five thousand QUEST beneficiaries at the
19	start of the initial enrollment period, a maximum of eight
20	thousand two hundred fifty beneficiaries can be auto-assigned to
21	the chosen health plan to receive these beneficiaries, and the
22	remaining beneficiaries who do not voluntarily enroll in a plan

3	method to	randomly pick the beneficiaries to be auto-assigned.
4	Furth	ner, this Act adopts the recommendations of the
5	department	of human services and requires the department of
6	human serv	vices to provide for the following safeguards and
7	quality co	ontrol measures to address previously stated concerns
8	of potenti	al disruption of services by:
9	(1)	Including in the request for proposals that each
10		medicaid QUEST recipient will have sixty days to
11		positively choose a health plan;
12	(2)	Granting each medicaid QUEST recipient who may be
13		auto-assigned, an additional ninety days to change the
14		recipient's health plan for any reason;
15	(3)	Ensuring that if a person is auto-assigned to a new
16		plan and that person shows up by mistake for a visit
17		at the person's previous plan's provider, there will
18		be no disruption in receiving medical services, even
19		if that provider is not in the new plan, and also
20		ensuring that the client will receive treatment at
21		that time, for which the department of human services
22		will pay the provider;

1	(4)	Ensuring that the person will also have the
2		opportunity during a visit to a provider to
3		immediately opt out of the auto-assigned health care
4		plan and switch back into the previous plan or into
5		another plan; and
6	(5)	Ensuring that the department of human services will
7		conduct a public awareness campaign, including the
8		option to contract with advocacy, outreach, and other
9		community groups to educate medicaid QUEST recipients
10		about their new plan options and shall include a
11		provider directory of fully contracted providers to
12		assist beneficiaries in their decision-making.
13	SECT	ION 2. The department of human services, Med-Quest
14	division,	that is responsible for the QUEST program and the
15	issuance o	of a request for proposals for health plans to submit
16	proposals	to provide required medical and behavioral health
17	services 1	to eligible QUEST recipients, shall include the
18	following	basic provisions in the request for proposals that:
19	(1)	All individuals who are existing members of QUEST
20		health plans will be required to select a health plan
21		for the initial enrollment period that shall last for
22		a period of sixty days; and

1	(2)	After the conclusion of the sixty-day period, a
2		certain number of existing members of QUEST health
3		plans who have not selected a health plan shall be
4		assigned by the department of human services to a
5		health plan according to the auto-assignment algorithm
6		described in the request for proposal.
7	SECT	ION 3. In addition to the provisions set forth in
8	section 2	, the department of human services shall also include
9	the follow	wing provisions in the request for proposals to
10	minimize a	any possible disruption that may occur to the total
11	number of	QUEST recipients who have not selected a health plan:
12	(1)	The department of human services shall not auto-assign
13		more than the number of recipients that is equivalent
14		to five per cent of the total existing QUEST
15		recipients at the start of the initial enrollment
16		period;
17	(2)	The department of human services shall randomly choose
18		five per cent of the recipients to be assigned in
19		accordance with this section; and
20	(3)	The number of QUEST recipients who have not selected a
21		health plan and are not auto-assigned as stated above
22		shall remain with and be assigned back to the health

1		plan they were enrolled in at the start of the initial
2		enrollment period.
3	SECT	ION 4. The department of human services shall also
4	include t	he following provisions in the request for proposals
5	that are	the safeguards proposed by the department of human
6	services:	
7	(1)	A provision to grant each medicaid QUEST recipient who
8		may be auto-assigned an additional ninety days to
9		change the recipient's health plan for any reason;
10	(2)	A provision to ensure that if a person is auto-
11		assigned to a new plan and that person shows up by
12		mistake for a visit at a previous plan's provider,
13		there will be no disruption in receiving medical
14		services, even if that provider is not in the new
15		plan, and also to ensure that the client will receive
16		treatment at that time, for which the department of
17		human services will pay the provider;
18	(3)	A provision to ensure that the person will also have
19		the opportunity during a visit to a provider to
20		immediately opt out of the auto-assigned health care
21		plan and switch back into the previous plan or into
22		another plan; and

1	(4)	A provision to ensure that the department of human
2		services will conduct a public awareness campaign to
3		educate medicaid QUEST recipients about their new plan
4		options, including a provider directory of fully
5		contracted providers in each plan to assist
6		beneficiaries in their decision-making.
7	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
