A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the United States 2 Army's 68th Medical Company's Medical Assistance to Safety and Traffic helicopters have served Hawaii for the past thirty-one 3 years. These military aeromedical helicopters have transported 4 over seven thousand patients and saved countless lives by 5 transporting patients from rural areas, particularly in West Oahu and the North Shore of Oahu to tertiary hospitals. Located 7 8 at Wheeler Army Air Field, the aeromedical helicopters provide a 9 vital service at no cost to rural Oahu. However, the legislature also finds that due to the 10 increased military activity in Afghanistan, Somalia, and Iraq, 11 the aeromedical helicopters may soon be deployed to those areas, 12 leaving rural Oahu residents without aeromedical services. The 13 legislature believes that providing intra-island aeromedical 14 services to rural Oahu is necessary for the health and safety of 15 residents and therefore is a matter of statewide concern. 16 It is not the intent of this Act to supplant existing 17
- ground or fixed-wing transport, especially for routine or 18

1	non-emergency inter-facility transportation. The aeromedical
2	helicopter unit would use triage protocols to ensure the
3	medically appropriate dispatch of the unit. Helicopter use
4	would be based on national aeromedical triage and transport
5	guidelines as established by the Association of Air Medical
6	Services, the American College of Surgeons, and the National
7	Association of Emergency Medical Services Physicians.
8	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to provide
9	intra-island emergency aeromedical services to rural Oahu only.
10	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
11	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
12	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 for
13	the director of health to contract with an existing government
14	agency or United States military unit to provide intra-island
15	roto-wing emergency aeromedical services for rural Oahu only:
16	(1) Provided that the emergency aeromedical helicopter
17	services:
18	(A) Shall not supplant existing ground or fixed-wing
19	transport, especially for routine or
20	non-emergency inter-facility transportation; and
21	(B) Shall use triage protocols that are based on
22	national aeromedical, triage, and transport

2		Medical Services, the American College of
3		Surgeons, and the National Association of
4		Emergency Medical Services Physicians; and
5	(2)	Provided further that the city and county of Honolulu
6		shall share equally with the State in the cost to
7		contract with an existing government agency or United
8		States military unit to provide intra-island roto-wing
9		aeromedical services for rural Oahu only; provided
10		that no fund shall be made available under this
11		section unless the city and county of Honolulu
12		provides \$ for the purpose for which this
13		sum is appropriated The sum appropriated shall be
14		expended by the department of health for the purposes
15		of this Act.
16	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
