## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TIME LIMITATIONS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 701-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (2) to read as follows:
3	"(2)	Except as otherwise provided in this section,
4	prosecuti	ons for other offenses are subject to the following
5	periods o	f limitation:
6	(a)	A prosecution for manslaughter where the death was not
7		caused by the operation of a motor vehicle must be
8		commenced within ten years after it is committed;
9	(b)	A prosecution for a class A felony must be commenced
10		within six years after it is committed; provided that
11		a prosecution for a class A felony under chapter 707,
12		part V or VI, committed when the victim was under
13		eighteen years of age, must be commenced within ten
14		years after it was committed.
15	(c)	A prosecution for any felony under part IX of chapter
16		708 must be commenced within five years after it is
17		committed;

1	(d)	A prosecution for any other felony must be commenced
2		within three years after it is committed; provided
3		that a prosecution for a class B or C felony under
4		chapter 707, part V or VI, committed when the victim
5		was under eighteen years of age, must be commenced
6		within six years after it was committed;
7	(e)	A prosecution for a misdemeanor or parking violation
8		must be commenced within two years after it is
9		committed; and
10	(f)	A prosecution for a petty misdemeanor or a violation
11		other than a parking violation must be commenced
12		within one year after it is committed."
13	SECT	ION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
14	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
15	begun, be	fore its effective date.
16	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
18	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
